## The Challenge Increases

### Borden High U.I.L. Academic Teams set for Regional Meet

Two weeks ago, they took care of business and came out far ahead of their nearest competitors en route to an overwhelming district championship.

Now, the challenge is greater, and the stakes are heightened.

Eleven students from Borden High School are set to compete this weekend at the Region II-A U.I.L. Academic Meet on the campus of Hardin-Simmons University in Abilene.

These students either placed in the top three individually or were a part of a first place team at the district contest.

Senior Micah Hensley and junior Kyle Pinkerton lead the B.H.S. contingent in pursuit of returning berths to the U.I.L. Academic State Meet.

Hensley qualified for the State Meet in 2001 in Feature Writing. This year, she will have three opportunities to return to Austin as she competes in the Feature, Editorial, and News Writing. She won district in all three events.

Pinkerton is also searching for a return to Austin in Extemporaneous Persuasive Speaking. He finished second at the regional meet last year as a sophomore and

advanced to the State Meet. This year, he won the event at the district meet. Pinkerton will also compete in Headline Writing (second at district) and as a part of the district-winning Current Issues & Events team.

Seniors Michele Bond and Talin Pepper will be making their last attempts to advance to the State Meet.

Bond is a returnee to Abilene for the second straight year in Lincoln-Douglas Debate and will also compete in Extemporaneous Informative Speaking after winning the district contest.

Pepper will be making his third trip to Abilene as he leads the district-winning Literary Criticism team in its fight for a state berth. Individually, he won the district meet as well.

Sophomore John Wilson will lead the Current Issues and Events team following a team and an individual first place finish at the district meet. He will also compete in Extemporaneous Persuasive Speaking in which he was second at district.

Completing the Current Issues and Events

team along with Wilson and Pinkerton are juniors Clay John Anderson (sixth at district) and Dusty Gwinn.

Sophomore Tyler Wallace will return to Abilene for the second time in Prose Interpretation following a winning performance at district. He will also compete as a part of the Literary Criticism team.

Garrett Chapman, also a sophomore, will compete in Extemporaneous Informative Speaking. He was third at the district meet and is making his first trip to regionals.

Rounding out the B.H.S. regional qualifiers are freshmen Andrew Lamming and Trey Soto. Lamming will compete in both Extemporaneous Informative Speaking and Lincoln-Douglas Debate. Soto serves as the third member of the Literary Criticism team.

The top three individuals and first place team in some events will advance from the Regional Meet to the State Meet in Austin on May 1-3.

# Lady Coyotes take runner-up at District Track Meet;

## Area Competition at Highland April 17<sup>th</sup>.

The Borden High School Lady Coyotes placed second in the District 9 track meet April 4 in Welch.

It was typical track weather with temperatures above 80 degrees and steady winds 20 to 30 miles an hour. The winds would lie for the finals as the sun went down.

Aspermont won the meet followed by the Lady Coyotes. Dawson claimed third place.

In order to advance to area in two weeks, the girls had to place in the top four in each event.

Most of the young ladies are still alive to compete at Highland April 17.

The 400m relay was first with the best time recorded this year (54.19).

Running on the relay were Pati Rodriguez, Cassidy Rinehart, Menda James, and Micah Hensley.

The 800m relay took the silver medal in what was also their best time: 1:56.57. Rinehart and Rodriguez along with Emily Mayes and Shayla Gass participated as a team in this event.

The 1600m relay also ran its best time of the season, shaving off six seconds last week's time.

Competing against top team Aspermont, the girls were faced with a challenge in the mile relay, the evening's final event.

Rinehart set the tone when she refused to give up the lead and started the team out of the blocks with a 63.40.

She handed the baton to Mayes to ran her leg in 68.05 with BHS still leading.

Menda James, running the third leg, held off her competitors with her 68.77 quarter.

Micah Hensley then ran the entire lap with Aspermont's

anchor breathing down her neck. She rounded the 400 meters in a great time of 61.90. The girls led from start to finish.

Debbie married Bill Mumme on June 17, 1976 in Woodrow.

Dr. Mumme taught home economics at Slaton, Nazareth, Uvalde High Schools and pre-school at First Baptist Church, Hondo, Tx.

Survivors include her husband Bill; a daughter, Julie Mumme of Gail; parents, Dick and Kathryn Cade of Slaton; and sisters, Cindy Ferguson of Lubbock and Marsha Ganley of Philadelphia, Penn.

As a team, BHS shot well enough to earn silver medals and advance to Abilene April 21, 22.

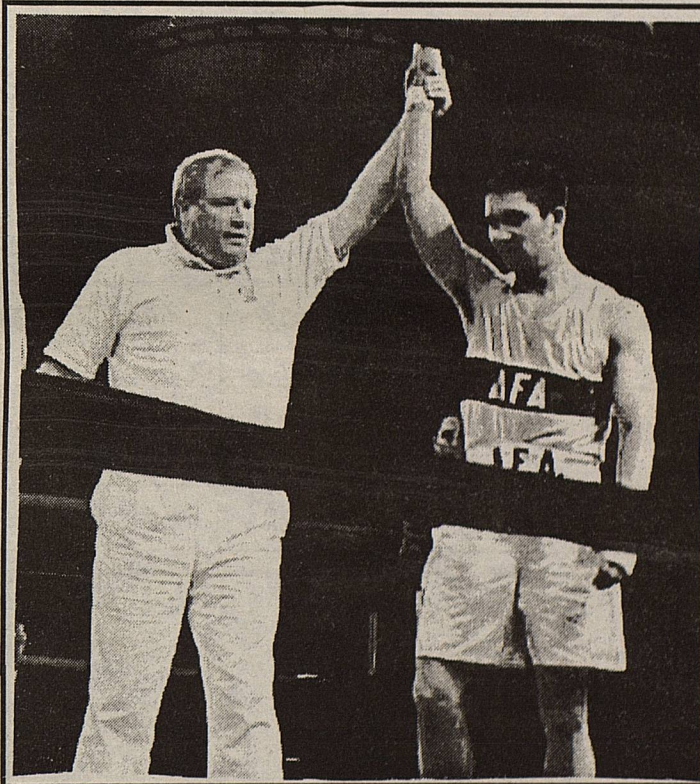
Other members of the boys'

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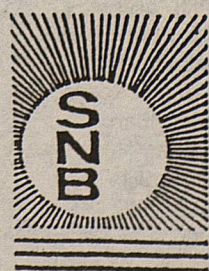
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# Borden County ISD SBDM Committee Meeting

Minutes from the meeting on October 29, 2002 were handed out and approved.

Becky Decker conducted training for the Borden County ISD SBDM Committee. She covered roles and responsibilities for each member and for the committee. Policies authorizing these roles and responsibilities were also discussed. She gave an update and progress report on the upcoming DEC visit. The next meeting with her will be April 14, 2003.

Staff Development ideas were discussed. Buddy Wallace and Pat Murphy will be working on getting input from the staff for next year's staff development. These suggestions will be forwarded to the ESC also.

Reports were given concerning the Special Education Program, the State Compen-

satory Program and the Title I Program. All three programs work with students having special educational needs. The three staff members work closely with each other and regular education teachers to help these students.

State testing dates and information concerning the upcoming results were discussed at length. Numerous handouts were given with more detailed information, such as the Student Success Initiative.

School calendar issues were discussed. The committee will seek input on the calendar from staff members and the community.

Budget items concerning satellite and video connections to the classrooms.

New requirements for graduation concerning TAKS tests.
