## Soviet Cosmonauts fail

| MOSCOW (AP) - Two Soviet cosmonauts failed to link up with an orbiting space laboratory today in a major dis appointment for the Russians at the start of their third decade of space exploration. <br> The Soviet news agency Tass said flight commander L.L. Col. Vadimir Kovaienok and fight engineer Valery Ryumin were unable to dock with the Salyut-6 space station and were preparing to return to earth in the Soyuz-25 spacecraft after little more than one day in orbit <br> Tass gave no indication what "Because of some deviations from the planned docking regime. the linkup operation was cancelled," Tass said. <br> The failure was the latest in a series that have dogged the | The Soyuz-23 mission a year ago was aborted after the spacecraft failed to complete a docking maneuver.
