"I learned," he said of this background, "to deal with individuals, committees and boards—and banking is much the same. The quality of banking is still determined by people, not machines."

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Burma, Land of Many Wonders

RANGOON, Burma (UPI)—It was 380 years ago that an Elizabethan traveler and trader set out from faraway England to open the spice and jewel markets of the Orient.

Ralph Fitch journeyed alone through India in 1583 and then onward across the Lushai and China hills into the Irrawaddy Valley and the ancient Burmese capital of Pegu.

Here lived the white elephants of the king of Burma. Fitch wrote of how he watched in wonder as the stately procession made its way to the river bank. Since Fitch's time, there have been many changes in Burma. There are still plenty of elephants around, but they don't live quite so comfortably. The elephant is an important beast of burden and does much of the heavy hauling in Burma, particularly in the mill-operations of the teak forests.

But change, for better or worse, has been the keynote of Burma's life down through the centuries. The present revolutionary government of the Union of Burma uses the catch-word "forward" in its program to change the Burmese way of life overnight, to bring it into harmony with the 20th century world.

Nearly Bloodless Coup

The revolutionary government led by Gen. Ne Win as chairman took over in an almost bloodless coup on March 2, 1962, from the tottering regime of Premier U Nu of the Pyidaungsu, or Union party, an offshoot of the anti-fascist Peoples Freedom League (AFPFL), the party that led Burma to independence under Gen. Aung San. The latter, like many of his contemporaries in Southeast Asia, was assassinated July 19, 1947, only a few months before independence was proclaimed on Jan. 4, 1948.

Smoking Rules Are Changed

ST. LOUIS, Mo. (UPI)—No more smoking during the noon hours for students at Pattonville Senior High. The school board has changed its mind.

"We haven't caught a smoker yet and hope we don't," said principal James McMahon. "We could not have asked for finer cooperation from the students."

For five years students in the suburban high school were permitted to smoke during the noon hour in designated areas.

But Pattonville R-3 school board bowed to moral obligations and medical science Wednesday and reversed its policy.

"The school should point out the possible consequences of smoking rather than be a party to encouraging youth to smoke," the board said in instituting the new rule.

Now a smoking violation will carry a two weeks suspension for the first offense. And a penalty is provided for the student who carries tobacco.

Britain Granted Independence

Burma is seven times the size of England but has only one-third Britain's population in an area of 261,789 square miles. With independence granted by British Prime Minister Clement Attlee in 1948, the Burmese voted to leave the British Commonwealth. On Jan. 4, 1948, the 20 million Burmese and other constituent races — the tribes of Kachin, Chin, Shan, and Kayah — became independent and their country became the 58th member of the United Nations.

Rangoon, the capital, is designed like an American city with broad parallel avenues crossed at right angles by narrow streets. It is a city bursting at its seams. Designed for a maximum population of 600,000 it now has one million. Three new "satellite" towns have sprung up almost overnight north of the city on sites that were once scrubland.

Mainly Produces Rice

Burma mainly produces rice. Its exportable surplus today, however, is far below the pre-World War II record of 3.5 million bushels. Burma now averages 2 to 2.5 million bushels annually. Also exported is the finest teak; minerals like tin, tungsten, and wolfram; beans; precious stones such as rubies and emeralds; jade, and small quantities of lead and silver.

The dominant religion in Burma is Buddhism, although there are substantial numbers of Christians, Muslims and Hindus.

Pineapple Ham Roll Easy and Delectable

- 1 can (1 lb. 4 1/2 oz.) sliced pineapple
 - 3/4 lb. ground ham
 - 3/4 lb. ground veal
 - 1/4 cup Cream of Rice
 - 2 eggs
 - 2 teaspoons prepared mustard
 - 2 tablespoons ketchup
 - 1 teaspoon salt
 - 1/4 teaspoon pepper
 - 1 cup light brown sugar
 - 1/2 teaspoon Kitchen Bouquet
 - 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
 - 2 tablespoons vinegar
 - 2 cans (1 lb. each) yams
- Drain pineapple reserving liquid. Blend together ham, veal, Cream of Rice, 1/4 cup pineapple juice, eggs, mustard, ketchup, salt and pepper. Divide meat mixture into 7 portions and form patties. Using a shallow baking dish or ovenware platter, form a long roll alternating a meat patty with a

pineapple slice beginning and ending with meat. To hold roll together, put a large skewer through it from end to end or one from each end. Bake 30 minutes in preheated 325 degrees oven. Then baste with pineapple glaze made by blending together and bringing to a boil, brown sugar, 1/2 cup pineapple juice, Kitchen Bouquet, cloves and vinegar. Bake 1 hour longer basting every 20 minutes. After second basting, place yams around roll on platter. The glaze and drippings from the roll will baste the yams. Makes 8 servings.

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
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
Comparison Makes Young Italian Star Unhappy

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — Singer Andy Williams represents a mixture of professional popularity and a personal life that is conservative by Hollywood movie star standards.
Williams entered show business in a singing quartet with his three brothers. The quartet was moderately successful but never attained the professional heights that Andy has reached on his own.
He has his own television show on NBC and his records have sold millions of copies. Andy's income from television, personal appearances and records has been invested in holdings that will give him added income.
His father, who is in the real estate business in the San Fernando Valley residential area near Hollywood, has advised Andy on land purchases. The singer owns both acreage and apartment buildings. Despite his increased wealth, Andy insists he hasn't changed.
"I haven't changed my way of living," he said. "I don't want a yacht or airplane."
In Hollywood, it's a common occurrence for newly-rich performers to go on spending sprees for motor launches, sailboats, houses which are financially over their heads and other unnecessary expenditures.
Andy lived in an apartment until 1961 when he married French actress Claudine Longet. Since then he has purchased a Regency style house in the Hollywood hills overlooking Sunset Boulevard.
The house had one large bedroom, a dining room, kitchen and living room until Andy started remodeling it in preparation for their first child. There's also a swimming pool in the yard.
"We've just added three rooms," Andy said. "One for the baby, one for a nurse, and one is a library."
Andy's hobbies are golf and art. The latter he shares with his charming wife.
"What time I have off, I spend on the golf course," he said. "Maybe I can get on the course once or twice a month. But when I'm on the road doing personal appearances, it might be every day. Sometimes my wife goes with me. She doesn't play. She likes the grass, trees and squirrels."
Andy occasionally plays golf with Fred MacMurray, Lawrence Welk and Bob Newhart.
Williams has been collecting art works, paintings and sculpture since before he was married.
"I was interested mostly in the French impressionist school and I started reading about it," he said. "But the French impressionist work is way out of reach in price. So I switched to the modern French, Spanish and American painters."
The personable singer dines out at filmdom restaurants once or twice a week. But he and his wife also like to entertain at small dinner parties in their home. Sometimes Andy cooks.
"My cooking is just steaks," he said. "It's simple to cook steaks. Just get good meat, pour salt and pepper on it and put it on the grill. In our kitchen we built a large dutch oven thing."
Andy said, "I'm in good shape" when asked about his career.

Connally to Push For Larger Seawall

AUSTIN (UPI)— Gov. John Connally said yesterday he will go to Washington to push federal construction of a seawall to protect Beaumont and Port Arthur from hurricane tidal waves.

The two cities in Jefferson County have been heavily battered in recent years by hurricanes. Rains touched off last week by Hurricane Cindy caused \$10 million damage in the county.

Connally outlined three other reasons for his two-day trip to Washington:

—Coordination of state-federal action on construction of Toledo Bend dam on the Sabine River in East Texas.

—Federal completion of the screwworm eradication program in Texas.

—Work on a proposal to make the Guadalupe Peak area a national park in West Texas.

Invitation Due
If he gets to see President Kennedy, Connally said, he will invite him to visit Texas. His Washington trips the first a Texas governor has made in recent years to push for state projects. Connally was President Kennedy's first secretary of the Navy and is a close political associate of Vice President Lyndon Johnson.

Connally said he will leave Austin Oct. 2 and return to Dallas Oct. 4 to officially open the State Fair of Texas the next day.

The governor, at a press conference, refused to discuss his stand on the current congressional redistricting controversy.

"We will have to wait and see what the three federal judges do in the Houston case," the governor said.

Houston Republicans filed suit to force congressional redistricting. The case was heard Monday and a decision is expected in about two weeks.

Connally said he has no course of action at this time regarding redistricting. "We'll just have to wait for the court opinion," he said.

Discloses Other Plans
The governor said while in Washington he planned to consult with Agriculture Department officials regarding the Toledo Dam project and the screwworm eradication program.

He said he hopes to get the federal agency "to take over this program by the next fiscal year." The current program in Texas by next year will have spent \$12 million.

Connally said he planned to explain the success of the state's screwworm eradication program which has drastically cut down infestation in South Texas.

During his Washington trip, Connally said he also planned to talk with the Texas congressional delegation, and particularly Rep. Jack Brooks of Beaumont, regarding a proposed seawall around Jefferson County.

Wants Action
"I hope to see what can be done to push this project along," Connally said, mentioning damage in recent years to the area from hurricanes.

He also plans to confer with interior department officials regarding the oil imports program, and the Guadalupe Peak area to determine if there is any interest in making it a national park.

"I believe this area is very worthy to be considered as a state park," he said.

Sees Difficult Situation
Connally said if the repeal MEMENTO
