BC Students Compete Thursday in Annual Meet

Yes, it is that time of year Kindergarten once again. Not only is it the holiday season, but it is also the U.I.L. Academic Meet season!

U.I.L. Academic competetion comes to the forefront this Thursday for approximately seventy-five students who will represent Borden County Elementary and Junior High Schools at the District 9-A West Zone U.I.L. Academic Meet in Garden City.

Students from Garden City, Grady, Ira, Klondike, and Sands will join BC in the one-day competition on December 9, 2004, in just over sixty different contests on different grade levels.

Borden County students and their academic coaches have been working for weeks now in preparation for the contests which range from oral reading and storytelling to science and mathematics.

The competition is divided into elementary (K-5) and junior high (6-8) divisions. Students will compete in both individual and team contests in hopes of gaining points, which are then totaled for each school in order to declare overall championships in each division.

Coyotes finishes Runner-up to Post in Tournament

Borden Coyotes used a 3 game winning streak in the Coyote Christmas Classic to propel themselves to the championship contest in a rematch with the Post Antelopes.

In the 1st contest, against the Forsan Buffalos, all 8 of the Coyote players manage to contribute on the scoreboard as they all scored some points in topping the 50 point mark for the first time this season. That coupled with the continued defensive effort allowed the hometown Coyotes to handle the Forsan Buffalos 53 to 29. Garrett Chapman hit a career high 15 points, followed by 11 points from Ben Griffin, 8 pts. From J'Ryan Gicklhorn, Austin Tarleton added 7 pts., John Wilson and Aaron Pigford scored 4 pts and Garrett Thomas and Adam Carter each tallied 2 points.

In the late Thursday contest the hometown team used a stifling defensive effort to take a 20 to 12 lead over the visitors from Sterling City at the half. In the 3rd quarter a rash of turnovers allowed the Eagles to climb back into the game. In fact, what once was as much as a 10 point lead turned into a 5 point deficit for the Coyotes in the 4th quarter. The Coyotes however, regained the lead at 36 to 34 with just over a minute to play before an errant shot turned into a fast break basket for the Eagles. But, after holding the ball for the majority of the final minute, a slick pass to J'Ryan allowed the Junior to give the Coyotes their final points and a very exciting two point victory 38 to 36. J'Ryan had a career high 10 points, while Aaron also had a career high 12 Ben added 6 pts, Garrett Thomas scored 4 pts and Adam Carter added 6 pts.
