AMARLLLO - The pros and cons of the
proposed Strategic Arms Limitation
 Soviee Union were debated Tuesday at
Amarillo college by experts from the leading private groups supporting and opposing the treaty.

It is clear that without the treaty our
problems with the Soviets would be far worse.: said Dr Herbets would be far representative of Americans for SALT. th principal private organization in the U.S. supporting the treaty. "We are much better off with the treaty than without it.
In my opinion we should not only not
ratily this treaty. but we should not discuss a future treaty until the Soviets make a meaning ful step toward nuclear
reduction." said Major General J. Milnor
