The National Enviromental Policy Act of 1969 requires federal
agencies to assess agencies to assess the impact on the environment of government
actions at home and abroad. So the National Organization for the Reform of Marijuana Laws
found out about the. paraquat program. distrusted found out about the. paraquat program. distrusted government
assurances that the herbicide was not harmful to smokers, and went 10 court to insist on an environmental impact statement.
The State De The State Department resisted. lost in a lower court, appealed and
finally settled out of court on April 24 , agreeing to provide a impact statement. It paid the Mitre Corp $\$ 255211$, document that discusses everything from the effect of the marijiuana
dital eradication program on family life among the Mexican campesinos

## Wheat crop shaping up

 Winter wheat production . which accounts for about three.fourths ofthe total. was estimated Thursday by the Agriculture Department at 1.39 billion bushels.

Although such a harvest would be 11 percent larger than the 1978
output of 1.25 billion bushes. it would be about 4 percent smaller than
