spending years trying to get permission to emigrate from the Soviet Union.
Once in the U.S. Embassy, the families hoped something could be done to secure their right to emigrate. After all, didn't the Helsinki freaty between the of emitration? Those seven Christians are still waiting virtually prisoners in the embassy. Attempting to enter the U.S. Embassy in Moscow is an act of courage or a Russian citizen. Burly police officers are stizen Russians foolish enough to try it. Yet these seven, knowing the limited chances of success, giving up everything they had, risking the per secution of their
families, decided it was worth a try. They are not alone. One of the reasons the Soviet government is not permitting these two housands of other religious persons in Russia to make a similar attempt. Undoubtedly the Chmykhalov and Vaschenko families felt as imprisoned outside the embassy as.they do inside.
