Clutch problems may have caused crash Nuclear waste disposal needed

HARRISON, Ark. (AP) - The driver of a bus that
cashed near JJsper last week may have had trouble crashed near Jasper last week $m$

an officicla investigating the crash. Tom Calderwood of the National Transportation clutch in the bus was out of adjustment and that the shiff linkage was binding against the rear axle. The
