Widespread flooding was reported along the Coastal Bend early today as the remnants of oncepowerful Hurricane Allen
continued to move inland from the Gulf of Mexico. The once-powerful hurricane was first downgraded to a tropical in northern Mexico, northwest of Laredo. But Allen left a damp footprint across a vast area of the
southern half of Texas and forecasters called for more rain and more flooding problems.
Thousands were taken to shelters during the night in Alice. Kingsville and Riviera as low lying area began to flood as heavy rainfull.
Most roads and highways south of a line from Beeville to Alice were closed or virtually inpassable because of high water. Roads
closed included the two major highways leading to the Lower Rio closed included the two major highways leadig
Grande Valley. U.S. 281 and U.S. 77 . Most or south rexas was under a flash flood watch and several also posted for a large area of Southwest Texas.
