Workers of the world-who are we?
Labor Day, instituted to honor American workers and their
contributions to American society, has also come to symbolize the end of summer the last fling at the beach or in the mountains before school
starts and vacation season ends. Does it men starts and vacation season ends. Does it mean any more than that these
days? A 1976 survey found that respondents who identified them selves as
working - class numbered only 4 percent. a declinine from 16 percent in in
1939. Those who identified themselves as middle or upper - midd le. 1939. Those who identified themselves as middle or upper - middle.
class increased from 51 percent in 1939 to 67 percent in 1976. The inflation of the last four years would probably reduce the num ber of
those who consider themselves upper - middle - class. But the trend seems clear. The self - identified working class is dec lining alm ost to
the point of extinction. singularly inapprops a question about the word "working class" overtone of social status. implying a pretty clear class structure. Most
people see the term "middle class" applying to econom ic position, regardless of whether one earned the money sitting at a desk or digging
a ditch. Few Americans worry about graduating from the "working class." Indeed one hopes that the dignity of labor is such that most Americans consider themselves to be workers in some sense or
another. whether we build freeways, fix plumbing, drive taxis, supervise other workers, run a small business, or manage
conglomerates. Labor Day, which could have developed into a day honor one carefully defined sector of society, has been em braced by all honors all people who work for a living, regard less of position.
It is characteristic of the lack of class - consciousness in Am er ica
that while the observance of Labor Day was instigated by unions, only about one in five American workers now be longs to a union, most of
those not unionized are content with that status, and many members wouldn't be if they hadn't had to join as a condition of workers
