If we must learn these lessons half way round the golobe, however, we must apply them much nearer home. For if the Unite Sates is to project political and military power in defense of its vital interests abroad (e.e.e. in the Middde East) interests have security in this hemisphere. We can no longer afford to neglect the growing threats to this security, or to obscure them weth wishes we have got.
