With a commanding lead the Coyotes in the second half began working on different aspects of their offense and began shooting from the outside more frequently.







Tips For Celebrating With Health in Mind

There's no doubt that the holidays pose a challenge for healthful eating. The problem often occurs with the amount and types of food we eat during the holidays, coupled with less physical activity - and more parties! Most people gain about one pound over the holiday season. This may not sound like much, but a pound or two each holiday season can amount to considerable weight gain over time, which can pose serious health consequences, especially for people with diabetes. The holidays may not be the easiest time to lose weight, but it is realistic to concentrate on not gaining weight.

QUALITY, NOT QUAN-TITY

There's no need to give up your favorite holiday fare or deprive yourself at holiday parties. Just follow these rules:

- · Don't arrive with an empty stomach. Be sure to eat a light meal beforehand.
- · Peruse all the offerings first. Load up on vegetables, add some protein such as turkey or other meats, and then fill in with samplings of carbohydrates, such as stuffing, potatoes, or pasta.
- · Offer to bring a healthful dish. The other guests also may appreciate the choice.

BRING BALANCE TO YOUR TABLE

One simple way to bring balance to your holiday table is with fruits and vegetables. Packed with nutrients and naturally low in calories, fruits and vegetables help you feel full with relatively few calories. Serve fresh vegetables and lowfat dips before a meal, and offer fresh fruit as part of dessert. A vegetable-based soup is a great starter to help fill you up, so you're less likely to overindulge on main dishes, sides and desserts. Start with half-size portions, and savor every bite. Remind yourself to eat until you're satisfied, not stuffed.

FEAST ON PHYSICAL **ACTIVITY**

It may be a busy time of the year to start or maintain an exercise routine, but it doesn't

that you can't make an activity such as shopping more physical. Take the stairs at the mall instead of the escalator, or park farther from the door. Start a tradition of physical activity as part of your family gatherings: organize a game of basketball or softball, go skating or sledding before your meal, or plan a walk or hike after the meal.

HOLIDAY MENU TUNE-UP

Here are some easy ideas:

- Baste turkey with fatfree chicken broth, wine, or apple cider instead of butter or drippings. Use a gravy separator to skim the remaining fat when making gravy.
- To give stuffing a fiber boost, use whole wheat bread instead of white, or try a stuffing made with wild rice, brown rice, or bulgur wheat. You can also add fiber and extra nutrients to stuffing or vegetable dishes by tossing in a handful of raisins, dried apricots, or chopped nuts.
- Mash white potatoes with low-sodium, fat-free chicken broth instead of milk, butter, and salt.
- Mash sweet potatoes with orange juice instead of butter, or try tossing sweet potatoes in a small amount of oil, sprinkling on some cinnamon and brown sugar, and roasting them until they're caramel-
- Make pumpkin pie with fat-free evaporated milk instead of whole evaporated milk - a simple way to slice off 200 calories and nearly 30 grams of fat from a pumpkin
- Try cutting sugar by one-third to one-half in traditional dessert recipes; increase the use of flavorful spices, such as cinnamon, nutmeg, or

of the sugar with a sugar substitute that's suitable for bak-

SAVOR SMALL **AMOUNTS**

Remember to count sweets as part of the total carbohydrates that you are allowed each day. This means that sweets shouldn't simply be added - instead, they should be substituted for other carbohydrates in

vanilla. Or try replacing some your meal plan. Talk to your diabetes educator or dietitian about ways to work in some holiday treats. It may mean eating less of other foods, more ex-

Texas Size Poinsettias

The sight of a giant greenhouse filled with several colors of poinsettias nearly took my breath away. Yellows, oranges, whites, pinks, apricot and various shades, combinations of colors and variegated varieties have joined the traditional red, which is still the favorite.

Bobbie Schulte of Ellison's Greenhouses in Brenham took me on a tour of the place. "That greenhouse is filled with 8,000 poinsettias going to Kroger stores in Houston," she told

Ellison's is one of the top greenhouse operations in Texas. It kicks off the poinsettia season in November with an open house featuring a huge Christmas tree made of poinsettia plants in pots. It is up only a few days, but thousands of people go see it.

"They come to look at the sea of beautiful, beautiful colors," says Bobbie. "We have the Texas orange and Aggie ma-

Customers can go through the greenhouses and select the plants they like. All of our flowers are pinched so they have more flowers on them. My favorite is Monet, which has cream-colored leaves with burgundy splotches."

The Christmas plants come in a variety of sizes.

"We probably grow the most sizes of anybody in the area. We do a two and a quarter inch pot, which has a poinsettia about three inches tall, all the way up to our Texas size which is six feet tall and six feet across and that is awesome. The leaf spread on the tree is about 24 inches. They're just gorgeous."

Those Texas size poinsettias

come in a big pot.

"It's a 22-inch nursery container with about 15 gallons of soil in it. The reason the plant gets so big is the way we handle

It starts on May first and gets special treatment in that we keep all the extra growth picked off the sides so it grows tall.

The Texas size is our trademark right now. They've become very popular. We have them in malls, banks, hotels and big office buildings."

Some people in warm climates plant the poinsettias in their yard.

"In the right area they will grow outdoors. They don't like it below 50 degrees, so you have to be careful where you plant

In south Texas they grow wild and get as tall as the

houses. Poinsettias originally came from Mexico back in the 1800's when the US Ambassador to Mexico, Joel Poinsett brought some back to the states."

With proper care, poinsettias can last much longer than just the holiday season. They need to be placed in a spot with bright natural light and the soil should be kept moist. Empty any water that drains into the container under your plant. If you let the plant sit in this water, the leaves will yellow and drop. The plants do best with temperatures not over 75 degrees during the day and not below 60 degrees at night.
