





# Coaches All-District Selections A Puzzler

4-AAAA coaches met in Amarillo to decide who they would allow on the alldistrict and all-zone teams for the 1969 football season.

Each coach is allowed two votes and each coach lists players from the different positions, either from his own team or an opposing team that he feels deserves

Trying to figure out just how the coaches arrive at their conclusions is one of the better puzzles we've ever tried to piece together. From looking over the players name and the players left off the teams, it would appear that it doesn't matter much about the individual, but how well his team did during the season. This isn't true in all cases, however, since some of the players and boni-fide qualifieds for the all-district and all-zone

But do the names David Creel, Richard Mason, Eddie Bradeux, Bob Giles, Tom O'Jibway, Jim VanPelt, Carroll Marirott or Dean Hayes ring a bell. Well, they didn't with me either.

However, Creel and Mason, from Amarillo and Palo Duro, respectively, were named to the first all-district offensive end positions. Bradeux was picked as first team defensive end and Giles and O'Jibway were the first offensive team tackles.

Not selected by the coaches were Larry Stockton of Lubbock, Joe Pyrne of Coronado and Mart Hanna of Plainview, Melvis Robinson of Borger, Tim West of Monterey or Steve Scott of the Harvesters.

All were tops in their respective zones on pass receiving. Stockton caught 22 passes for 237 yards; Byrne 16 for 277 and Hanna, 11 of 289 in the south zone. Robinson had nine catches for 103 yards, Scott eight for 138 and West eight for 232 yards in the north zone.


