2003-2004 Dress Code for Borden County ISD

The Borden County School's dress Code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disrup-tion, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following.

Borden County's students shall be dressed and groomed in a manner that is clean and neat and that will not be a health and safety hazard to themselves or others. Cloth-ing and grooming that in the principal's judgment may reasonably be expected to cause disruption of or inter-ference with normal school operation is prohibited.

The Borden County School prohibits pictures, emblems, or writing on clothing that

- 1. Is lewd, offensive, vulgar, or contains obscene lan-guage
- Advertises or depicts tobacco products, alcoho-lic beverages, drugs, or any other substance prohibited by the school
- Refers to satanic, cult, prison wear or gang activities.

The following guidelines will be used to determine appropriate

- 1. Dresses, skirts, split skirts and shorts should not be shorter than two inches above the knee. A student will lose the privilege of wearing shorts for the school year upon a third offense. Parents will be notified when the second offense occurs. Shorts must be tailored (hemmed with no frayed edges). No spandex biker shorts or wind shorts are allowed (loose-legged, athletic running shorts) and shorts shall not be too tight.
- Wearing of oversized or baggy pants and/or jeans is prohibited at school or at any schoolsponsored activity on or off campus. NO "saggin, baggin, or draggin." Pants must be an appropriate length and not drag the floor. Boy's pants will be worn at the waist and properly fit the waistline. NO excessive wide legged pants will be allowed. NO chains will be allowed on school property or at school sponsored functions.
- Shirts and blouses must be buttoned appropriately with midriff and back covered at all times. (Tops must be long enough that skin does not show when arms are lifted). Clothing shall be designed, constructed,

and worn in a manner that is not suggestive or indecent, and that shall promote proper decorum. The opening on any type of shirt shall not exceed the equivalent of the first button below the collar of a dress shirt. Tank tops and "See through chiffon blouses" will not be allowed unless they are worn with a crew neck Tshirt underneath it or a shirt worn over them during all school hours and activities. Tailored shirt shirttails must be tucked in unless you have a crew T-shirt underneath the shirt. (All tailored shirts will be buttoned and tucked into the pants or skirt when representing Borden County in any extracurricular activities). Footwear shall be a part of regular attire. House shoes are not acceptable footwear. Not metal cleats or plates on the soles of shoes shall be worn in the building.

Hair shall be clean and well groomed at all times while attending school, school and functions, school sponsored activi-ties. It will be styled in a manner that will keep it out of the student's

> eyes and not obstruct one's vision. No unnatural or bizarre hair colors or haircuts will be permitted. Eyebrows must not be notched or shaved in an unnatural manner. Male students' hair may be worn no longer than the top of the collar. In addition: geometric or unusual patterns will not be allowed to be shaved or cut in the hair, and boys may not wear pony tails, rat-tails, or Students are to be clean-shaven at all times. Mustaches and beards are not allowed. Sideburns shall not be worn lower than the bottom of the ear lobe and no wider than one inch at the base.

- Boys will not wear piercing jewelry. Girls may not wear exposed piercing jewelry other than earrings. No tongue piercing will be allowed for boys or girls.
- Sunglasses may not be worn in the building during school hours or events inside the building unless prescribed by a

A student who violates the dress code shall be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school. If not corrected, the student shall be assigned to in school suspension either for the remainder of the day or until a parent or designee brings an acceptable change of clothing to the school. Repeat offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action. The principal, in cooperation with the sponsor, coach, or other person is charge of

an extracurricular activity, may regulate the dress and grooming of students who participate in the activity (for example: cheerleader uni-forms may vary from normal according requirements to principal/sponsor approval). Students who violate these standards may be removed or excluded from the activity for a period determined by the school administration or sponsor and may be subject to other disciplinary

Violations of the Borden County Dress Code may be handled through the Student Code of Conduct.



A Safe Ride

About 55 percent, more than 23 million, of all kids ride a school bus every day. According to the National Safety Council, school buses travel about 4.3 billion miles each year. With all those miles and children, it's important that you and your friends take some responsibility to leep safe.

Going to the bus stop . . .

- Whenever possible, walk with friends and others from
- Do not walk in the street. Use sidewalks if they are there; otherwise, walk on the grass next to the street. If you have to walk in the street, walk as close to the curb as possible.
- Be alertand avoid any signs of danger.
- Obey traffic lights and signals.
- · When you are crossing the street, cross only at the corner and use crosswalks where possible. Look both ways before crossing.

While you wait for the bus .

- Make sure you dress right for the weather.
- Be aware that drawstrings, ties, straps and backpacks can get caught in bus doors, railings or aisles, so be extra careful when getting on or off the bus. You may want to consider shortening or removing those items.
- Arrive at the bus stop on time.
- Stay away from the street while you are waiting for the bus

Boarding the school bus . . .

- Do not approach the bus until it stops completely. Wait for the driver's signal to board.
- Enter the bus in single file. Do not push.
- Use the handrail.
- Take a seat quickly and sit facing forward.

Riding the bus ...

- Always obey the school bus rules.
- · Remain seated throughout the ride.
- Keep yourarms, hands and head inside the bus. Help keep the bus neat and clean.
- Do not put any belongings in the aisle, and keep them away from emergency exits.
- Eating and drinking are not allowed on the bus.
- Be courteous to the driver and other riders. Listen to any directions the driver gives you.
- Do not make noises or gestures that could distract
- the driver or annoy other passengers.

Leaving the bus ...

- Do not stand up until the bus comes to a complete
- Use the handrail when leaving the bus.
- Never walk behind the school bus.
- If you cannot see the bus driver, the driver probably cannot see you. Take five giant steps away from the bus, then you should be able to see the driver, and the driver should be able to see you.
- Never crawl under a bus. Do not bend down near or under the bus.
- If you have to cross the street, wait for the driver to signal, then cross the street in front of the bus.
- Look both ways before crossing the street.
- Never run back to the bus, even if you have forgotten. something.
