



Coyote Football season to kick off Friday

With two scrimmages behind them, the 2003 Borden Coyotes will line up Friday for the real thing: a season-opening contest against the visiting Meadow

The Broncos, a larger 1-A school who recently dropped down to the six-man level, will bring a quick, big squad in, in hopes of avenging last years loss to the Coyotes in Meadow.

Seniors Andy Lozano, Kyle Pinkerton, and Shane Tarleton may have other plans, though, as the three hope to lead the Coyotes back to the playoffs again this season.

Pinkerton and Lozano started last season while Tarleton saw ample time at the quarterback position, but all know it is going to be a challenge to fill the spots left by four departing seniors.

Lozano, a cousin to former All-State football player Ed Rodriguez, has the quickness and athleticism to earn the some individual honors himself, especially on the defensive side of the ball.

He can also be a threat on the receiving end of the ball as seen in last Friday's scrimmage against Jayton.

In six-man football, Pinkerton provides a scoring threat similar to that of a tight end position in 11-man football.

With his size quickness off the line, he should prove to be a key receiver for Tarleton.

In addition, Pinkerton will share kicking duties with talented sophomore J. Ryan Gicklhorn.

Tarleton looks to add some games under his belt to fill more comfortable in pressure situations under the

TV eating up family mealtime

A generation of "TVdinner" kids might be learning their eating habits Homer Simpson, from according to a survey.

Researchers at Baylor College of Medicine found that more than 42-percent of dinners eaten at home by Houston-area fourth-, fifthand sixth-graders during a one-week survey were consumed while watching television.

:"These findings troubling because family meals are important for children, from both a nutritional and developmental standpoint," said Dr. Karen Cullen, a behavioral nutritionist with the USDA/ARS Children's Nutrition Research Center.

Nutritionists are concerned that "TV-dinner" kids might tune out their natural hunger and the cues that tell them how full they are. They also point to research that suggests children tend to request food products that are more frequently advertised on television. Many of these products happen to be those that are low in nutritional value.
