Outpacing the Others

BC Elementary & JH Claim Academic Championships

If last week's District 9-A, West Zone U.I.L. Academic Meet is any indication, Borden County is in good shape for years to come.

Students from both Borden Elementary and Borden Junior High outpaced five other schools en route to claiming zone U.I.L. academic championships at the meet held last Tuesday and Thursday in Klondike.

While the elementary victory was a clear cut, 89 point win, the junior high will have to wait several weeks to officially declare their championship.

BJH ended the general academic meet a mere 2.3 points behind Grady (660.3 to 658). However, when points from the Jr. High One-Act Play contest are added on December 13, B.J.H. should come out on top of the final totals. Grady does not have a play competing, so any points by BC in that contest will assure a Borden County overall victory.

Points are awarded to schools after each contest according to how that school's students finish in the top six individually. Some contests also award points based on how the school's students score as a team.

Late Start Dooms Coyotes' Bid for Bi-District Crown; Finish Year at 6-5

A 34-point deficit proved insurmountable as the Sanderson Eagles claimed a bi-district championship over the Borden Coyotes for the second year in a row.

The 70-29 score is no indication, however, of the fight the Coyotes eventually put up.

Trailing 28-0 after one period of play, the BHS gave up another score as the second quarter got underway.

Some sideline "suggestions" by the coaching staff, though, finally kicked in as the Coyotes got on the board on a 46-yard touchdown run by Garrett Thomas.

His run began with some quick block on the left side by Adam Carter and quarterback Shane Tarleton which allowed Thomas to use his speed and get to the endzone.

Kyle Pinkerton, recently named the district's top performer in the kicking category, nailed the PAT to make it a 34-8 game.

The teams traded scores throughout the second period, with the Coyotes doing all they could to keep the game from being called on the 45-point rule.

With 2:37 remaining in the half, Tarleton found Pinkerton who caught the ball and ran 20 yards to the endzone.

Then, with only :12 left before halftime, Tarleton and John Wilson teamed up on a perfect 36-yard pass play.

The snap on the PAT was high, but Pinkerton recovered and found Billy Roper in the endzone for the one point conversion.

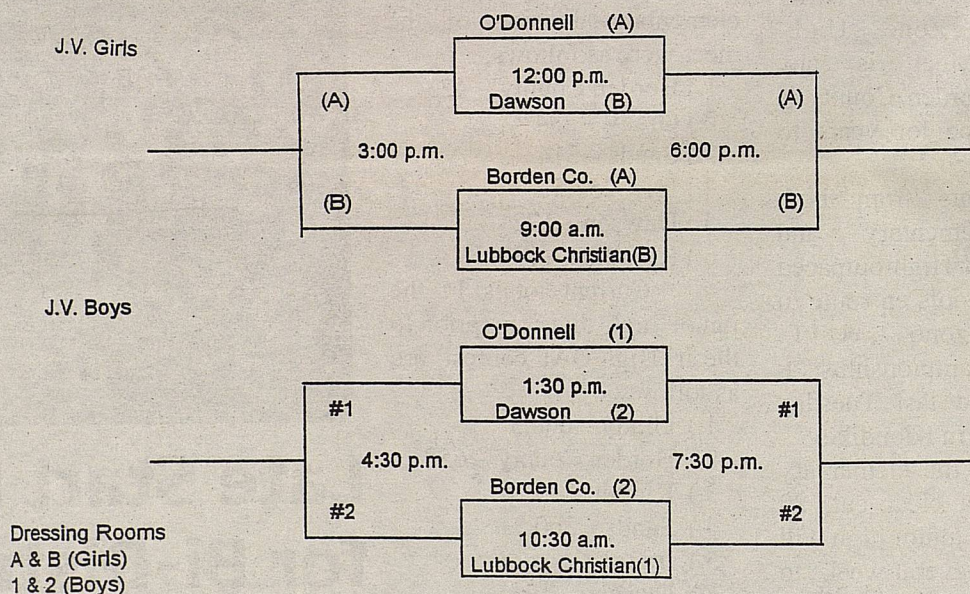
their arrival by Christmas.

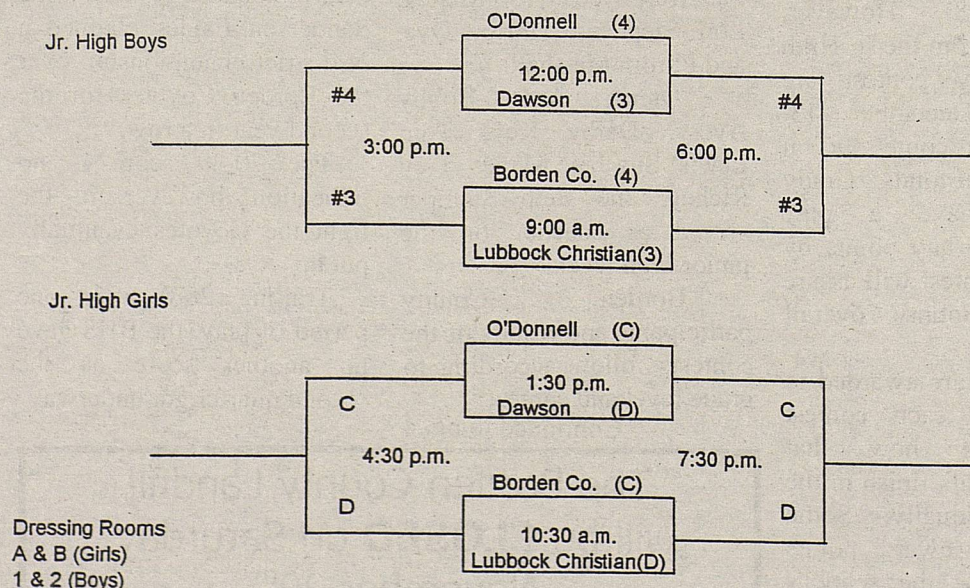

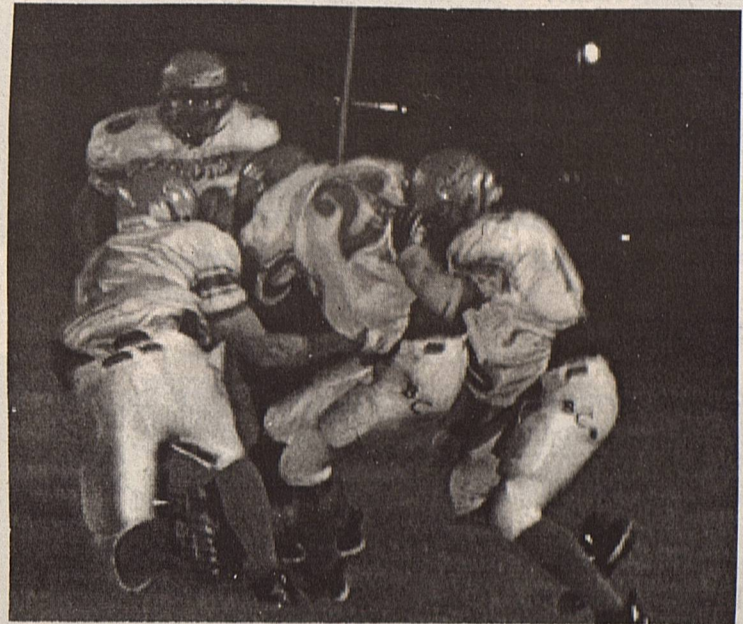

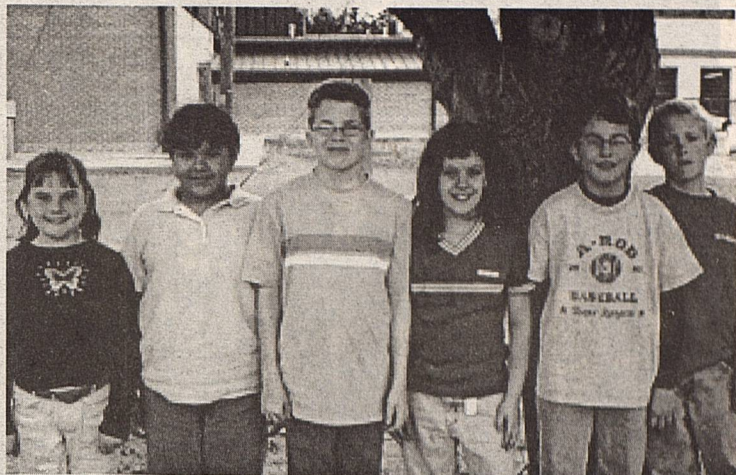
