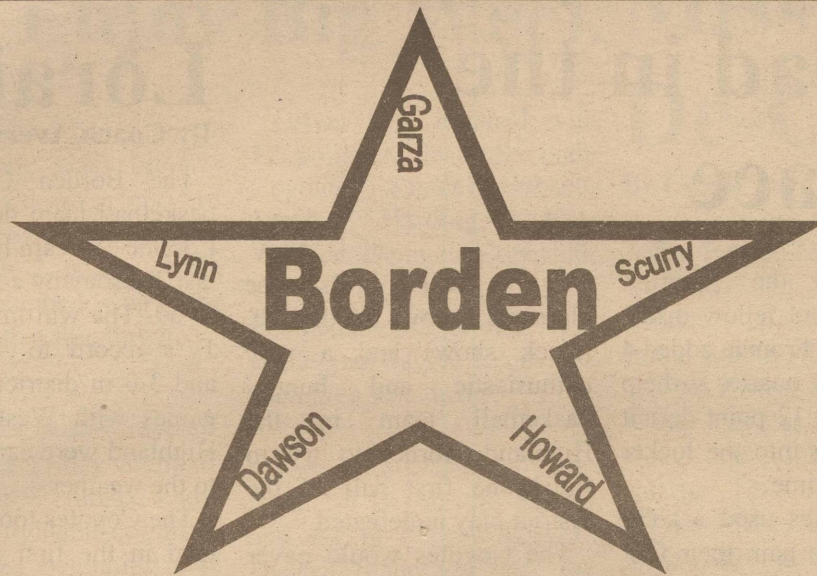

Big Wins Gives Coyotes First Half Lead in the District 12 Race

The Borden Coyotes played host to the Loraine Bulldogs on Tuesday to start the long hard week in front of them.

The Coyotes held off a very stubborn Bulldog team by connecting on 14 of 16 free. Asa Rutherford and Jacob Froman combined for a 14 for 14 effort for the entire contest.

The Coyotes dominated the defensive glass with Matthew Tatum and Zane Williamson and the good perimeter defense of Quentin Shafer and Michael Bullinger mixed with some quality spot play by senior Rowdy Clary.

The Coyotes limited the visitors to a mere 33 points, as they scored 45 points of their own led by Asa's 16 points and Jacob's 12 points. Zane Williamson scored 11 of the Coyotes 20 first half points on his way to a 13 point effort. Quentin and Matthew each contributed a basket to round out the scoring and a 45 to 33 victory.

On Wednesday, the Coyotes hosted the Westbrook Wildcats in a make-up of a make-up contest that was originally scheduled for last Friday, then Monday only to be pushed to Wednesday.

The Coyotes got off to a very sluggish start as they spotted the visitors a 16 to 6 first quarter lead before they finally got rolling.

The Coyotes behind the resurging Matthew Tatum got back into the game in the 2nd quarter as Tatum scored 10 of his season high 26

points in the quarter. Teammate and fellow inside player Jacob Froman added 4 points in the quarter to help cut the early 12 point deficit to 2 heading into the locker room at halftime.

The Coyotes used a solid 3rd quarter to gain their first lead of the contest, a lead that they would not relinquish the remainder of this contest as they outscored the visitors 17 to 10 in the 3rd period.

The Coyotes continued to dominate the inside play on both ends of the court as they limited the Wildcats to one shot per trip, as they stretched their lead to as much as 17 points.

In the end, the Coyotes had a very hard fought victory over the Wildcats who came into this contest undefeated in district play.

The Coyotes were led by Matthew with those 26 points, followed by Jacob with 17 points, Zane Williamson added 8 points, and Asa Rutherford poured in 7 points.

Also contributing to this huge district victory was Quentin Shafer, Michael Bullinger, Rowdy Clary, Michael Cooley and Flynn Chapman.

The final in this contest was 58 to 43.

On Friday, the Coyotes

would deal with the elements, (snow) the day off, (stock show) and a very enthusiastic and hungry basketball team in the Highland Hornet to try to finish the first half of the district play undefeated.

The Coyotes would never trail in this contest, but by the same token, would never have total control of this game either.

Jacob Froman, again led the way as he connected for 15 points in this contest. Matthew Tatum added a solid 10 points, Asa Rutherford added 8 points, Zane Williamson scored 5 points, and Michael Bullinger hit the game clinching basket with under a minute to play for his only two of the game. Also contributing was Rowdy Clary.

The win improves the Coyotes to 13 and 6 on the season and 5 and 0 in district play after this long and brutal week of basketball.

The Coyotes will travel to Ira on Tuesday for a huge contest. The Coyotes have not qualified for anything yet, but have put themselves in good position at the half way point.

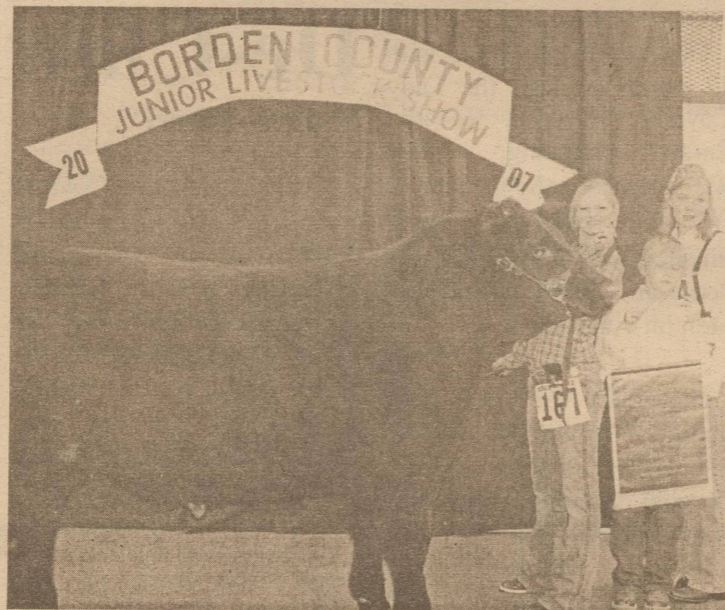

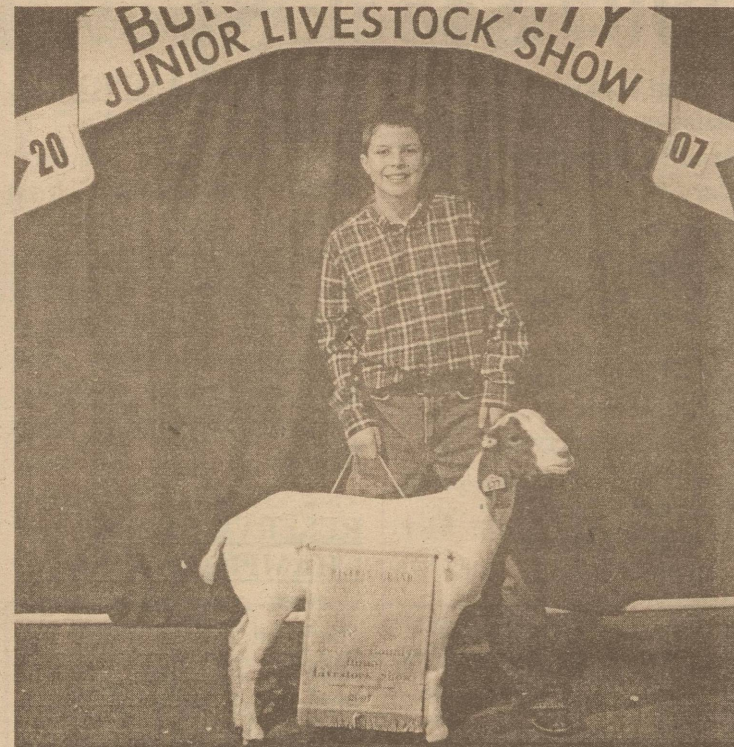

Obituary

Bob Plummer 1928 - 2007

Graveside services for Bob Plummer, age 78, of Henderson, were held at 10:00 a.m. Monday, January 15, 2007, at Rusk County Memorial Gardens under direction of Crawford-Crim-Bryan Funeral Home, in Henderson, TX.

Memorial services followed at 11:00 a.m. at First Baptist Church with Rev. Robert Hall officiating.

Mr. Plummer died January 13, 2007.

He was born August 8, 1928, in Venus to the late Will and Fannie Plummer.

He served in the Army during World War II in Berlin, Germany. He was a member of First Baptist Church. He was also a member of Scottish Rite, a Shriner, and a Master Mason for more than 50 years. He served on the Horse Racing Commission and he was director of American Quarter Horse Association, Texas Auctioneer Association, and auctioned for Youth Project Show.

He was preceded in death by his sister, Lorene VanDervender and her husband, Ernest "E.W."

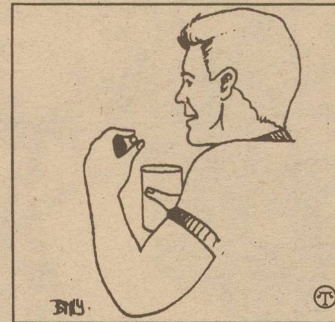

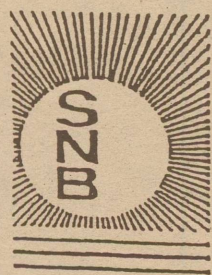
PUBLIC NOTICE

Pursuant to Article 258.002© of the Texas Transportation Code, the Commissioners Court of Borden County, Texas provides this notice to the public of its intention to convene a public meeting to receive comment upon the adoption of a County Road Map including each road in which the County claims the continued existence of a public interest and a right of access and egress for maintenance of an existing County Road. The roads in which the County claims a public interest have been maintained for many years, beginning some time prior to 1981, have previously been listed in a notice included in the 2006-07 Ad Valorem Tax statement. A proposed County Road Map depicting each road in which the County claims a public interest is available for inspection by the public at the office of the County Judge in the County Courthouse, during business hours, commencing December 1, 2006.

The Commissioners Court will conduct a public hearing on 2/7/2007, at 10:00 a.m., in the Commissioners Courtroom in the Borden County Courthouse. At this time, pursuant to Article 258.002(b), Texas Transportation Code, any person asserting a private right, title or interest in a road may appear before the Commissioners Court to object or protest the County's claim of its right to continue maintenance of the public roads depicted on the County Road Map. Any person asserting a private right, title or interest in a road may also file a written protest with the County Judge at anytime before the time and date of the scheduled public hearing. By way of this procedure, the County makes no claim affecting title, acreage, or ownership of the land, but seeks merely to establish and document the right of the County to continue maintenance of the existing county road in its present location and dimension.
