PITTSBURGH (UPI) - A member of the Federal Reserve Board said today inflation cannot be controlled without the "unfortunate and unwelcomed by-product" of rising unemploy-

The Fed official, Andrew F. Brimmer, called for new programs to cushion the blow of unemployment, possibly making the federal government the "employer of first instance" for the young and for racial minorities unable to find jobs elsewhere.



War Toll Extolled By Kennedy

Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., wage increases of about 25 per killed in the last four years, the majority of them by American railraod. and South Vietnamese military forces.

Kennedy told reporters that the Senate refugee subcommittee, which he heads, "recently learned that between the years 1965 and the present there have been more than 1 million civilian casualties in Vietnam. "Of that number, 300,000 have been killed," he added.

Kennedy said "some of the casualties have been stimulated by the Viet Cong but the majority of civilian injuries and deaths have been stimulated by ARVN (Army of the Republic of Vietnam) and U.S. forces."

Asked whether he meant that American and South Vietnamese troops caused the civilian casualties, Kennedy replied yes. Asked to comment on the alleged Song My massacre last year, Kennedy said he was 'deeply disturbed."

"This incident dramatizes most unfortunately, but in a significant way, the extent of the toll among civilians," he

Duvall said Saichek told him he chained the girl to the wall of his mobile home because he had to leave for 30 minutes and was afraid she would run away. He had had previous difficulties with the girl.

The Girls Playing The Field In Cleveland

CLEVELAND (NEA) - At a time when women are writing books about pro football and even trying to wiggle into football press boxes, it is not surprising that female representation has finally reached the playing field itself.

Here in the shadows of Municipal Stadium, at a place called Engewater Park, 30 females of various sizes and shapes slip out of miniskirts and pantyhose nightly and into shoulder pads and cleated shoes. They call themselves the Cleveland Belles and, although they are not ready to meet the Browns yet, they will be content just being on the same field.

"We hope to get some recognition by playing our games during halftimes of NFL games," says Syd Freedman, a Cleveland theatrical agent who formed the team. "I think football fans are sick and tired of watching marching bands and it's time for something different in halftime shows. And what's better than watching some beautiful women playing

Freedman is so intent upon selling the idea of women playing football, he is waging a one-man campaign to form the first women's professional league. Besides his team in Cleveland, he has formed teams in Pittsburgh and Toronto and is planning one for Detroit. To add a little authenticity, he has hired Marion Motley to coach his Cleveland team and, he says, several other pro stars are waiting - impatiently to coach the others.

"My goal is to have the first all-women's professional football league," he says. "When the team in Detroft is finally organized, we'll be ready. We've played several

exhibitions already this season and we drew 7.000 fans up in Toronto and another 6,000 in Pittsburgh. All we need is some national exposure and we can double, even triple, those figures."

Freedman's players come from all walks of life: housewives, secretaries, coeds. They play men's rules and, according to Freedman, the tackling is hardly ladylike. The stars of his Cleveland team are a quarterback who is the mother of four boys and a halfback, who Freedman says,

"has the best pair of legs in town."

"Our girls are paid very well. When we make road trips, they not only get their regular salary but we put them up in the best hotels and give them meals money and expenses - just like the pros. If you're going to try to put something over like this you've got to go big league. And we've been drawing so well we didn't have to pinch pennies, luckily."

Never heless, Freedman feels the success of the league depends ultimately on its receiving national exposure.

"On two occasions, we were scheduled to play during halftime of NFL games that were televised nationally, but both times the plans fell through. The bands just didn't want us stealing their show. But we're going to make it one of these days and when we do, we'll have the whole country talking. Can you imagine any guy leaving his TV set at

from the TV. Do you know how many of these same women would join their husbands at halftime to watch other women go at it? We'd probably draw a larger audience than the game itself. And TV football widows will be a thing of the past."

But, in case his football plans fall through, Freedman has another gimmick already in the works. He's promoting a "Miss Outer Space" contest in cooperation, he says, with NASA

itself. The winner will get a free trip to the moon.


