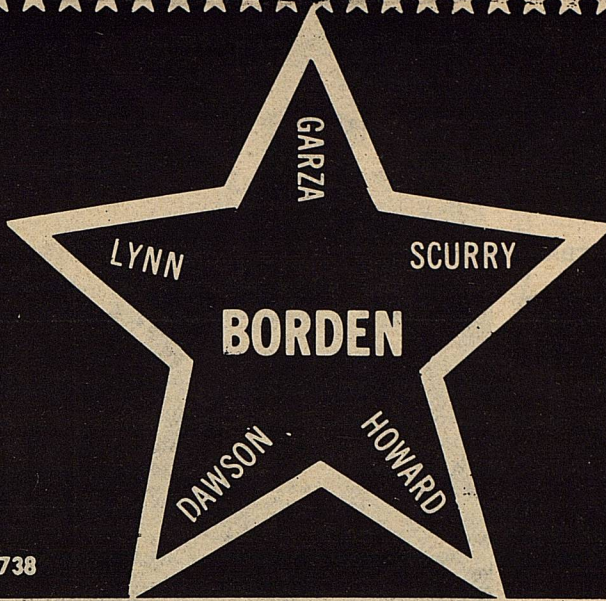

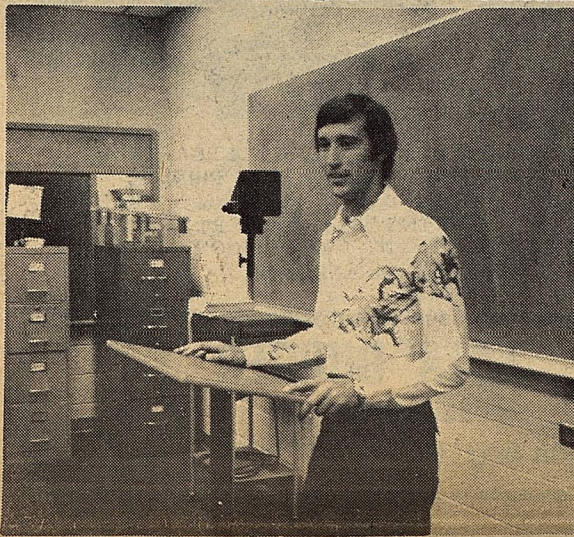

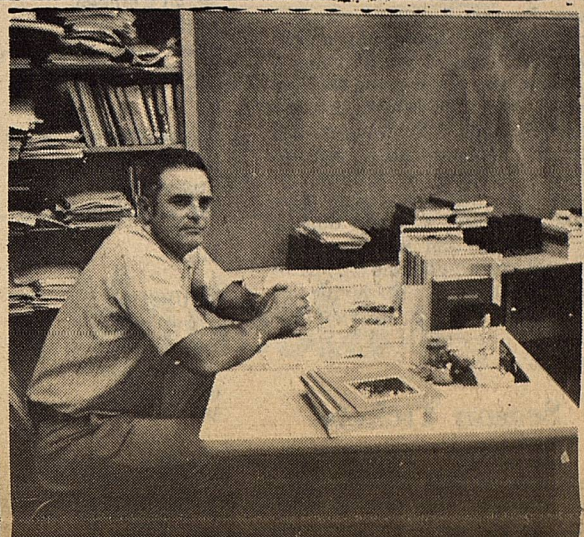

snow skiing.

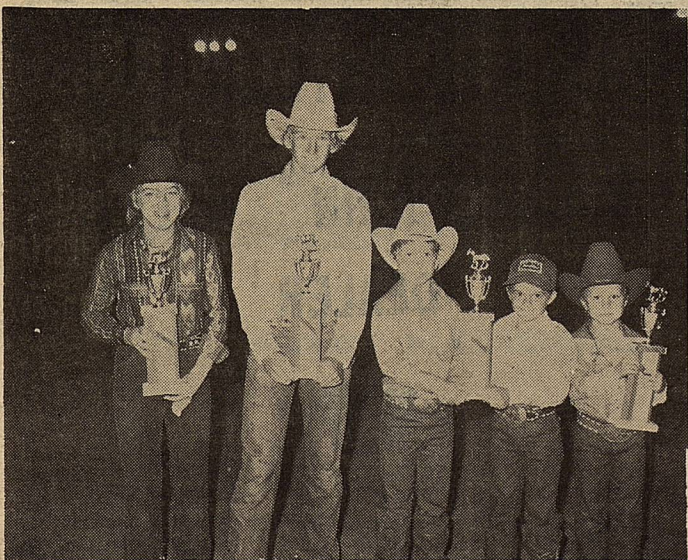

## Coyotes Scrimmage

The Borden County Coyotes took the field for the first time in the 1976 season last Thursday. The Coyotes scrimmaged the Sterling City Eagles at Borden County. The coaching staff was very pleased with the results. The Coyotes hit well and scored after only nine offensive plays. Sterling City was unable to score against the Coyote defense. However Sterling City did pick off a deflected pass and ran it in for a score. Outstanding Coyotes on offense were: Eurdist Rinehart, who scored the only Coyote touchdown. Ty Zant, Richard Smith, Johnny Jackson, Ben Thompson, Marlon Vaughn and Tim Smith, who did excellent job of blocking on the line, Jay Hataway made several outstanding pass receptions. On defense the standouts were: Eurdist Rinehart, Richard Smith, Jay Hataway, and Joe Zant. Ben Murphy intercepted the only pass the Coyotes picked off during the scrimmage. ## School Lunch Program

The Borden County School serves nutritious lunches every school day. Students may buy lunch for 30 and 35 cents.

Children from families whose income is at or below the levels shown on the attached scale are eligible for lunches free or at the reduced price of 20 cents. If your income is greater than those shown but you have unusually high medical bills, shelter costs in excess of 30 percent of your income, special education expenses due to the mental or physical condition of

a child, or disaster or casualty losses, your children may still be eligible.

To apply at anytime during the year for free lunches for your child or children, complete the attached application and return it to the school. Within 5 days of receiving your application, the school will let you know whether or not your children are eligible. If you do not agree with the school's decision you have the right to a fair hearing. This can be done by calling or writing Mr. James

McLeroy, Box 95, Gail, Texas 79738.

In certain cases foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If you have foster children living with you and wish to apply for such lunches for them, please notify us or indicate it on the application.

All children are treated the same regardless of ability to pay. In the operation of child feeding programs, no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color, or national origin.

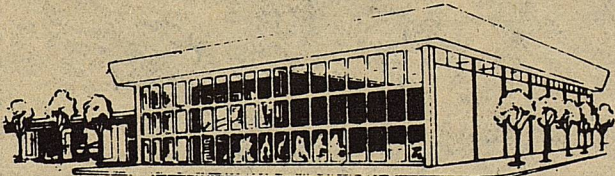

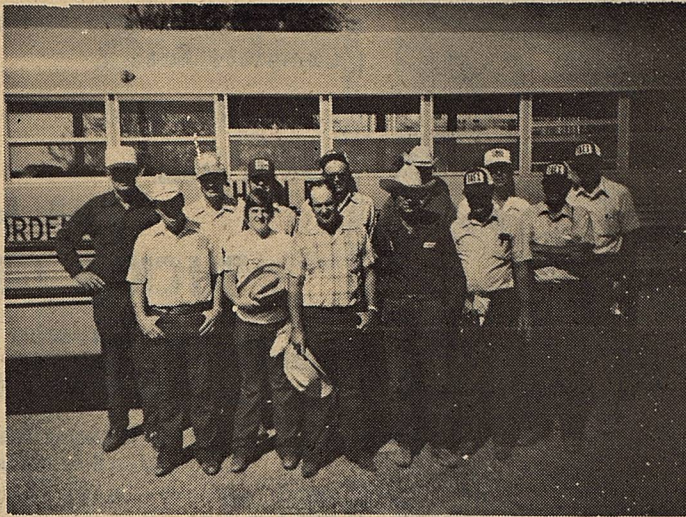

## Farm Tour

Borden County's Brush Control and Farm Tour was held last Tuesday and Wednesday.

Eighteen farmers attended the 1976 Borden County Farm Tour. Dr. James Supak, Area Agronomist; Dr. Pat Morrison, Area Entomologist; and Dr. Robert Berry, Area Plant Pathologist for the Texas Agriculture Extension Service, stationed at Lubbock, were present for the tour.

Mr. John Johnson, KFYO Farm and Ranch News in Lubbock, was also present for the tour.

The farmers looked at cotton varieties, wilt tests, green bug resistant sorghum, and johnson grass control.

Eight livestock producers attended the range tour last Tuesday. Dr. Tommy Welch, Area Range and Brush Control Specialist for Texas Agriculture Extension Service stationed in Vernon; Earnest Kiker, Borden County Extension Agent and the Borden County Livestock Committee planned and conducted the range tour.

Two stops were made on the Brush Control Tour. Stop one was on the Isaac Ledbetter Place, South of Gail. Eighty acres were treated with 1/2 pound 2,4,5-T per acre, 40 acres were treated with mixture of 1/4 pound 2,4,5-T and 1/4 pound dicamb per acre, and 40 acres were treated with Tordon 226 (1/4 pound 2,4,5-T and 1/4 pound picloram) per acre. These plots were established in June, 1973. Effectiveness of herbicides and herbicide mixtures for control of mesquite and other undesirable plants have been evaluated each year and published in Result Demonstration Handbook.

Stop 2 was on the Doyle Newton Ranch, North of Gail. Five plots were established in May, 1976 to study the use of Tordon 10k pellets to control Juniper Cedar. The five plots are individual plant treatment-1 pound per acre, and 2 pounds per acre, broadcast treatment-1 pound per acre, 2 pounds per acre, and 4 pounds per acre.

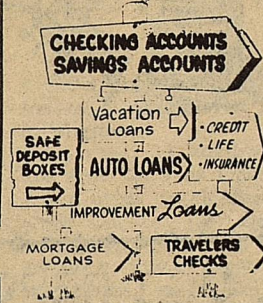

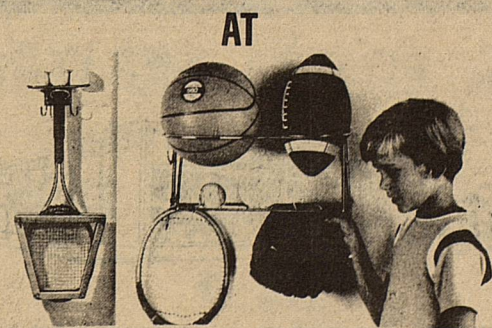
