

When you add that to about \$20,000,000,000 for running the government at home, our total bill for another year would be around \$42 billion.

So Congress' problem is: can all that money be spent without raising; taxes or putting, the country in the red?

Both House and Senate have "authorized" continuing the Marshall Plan for helping Europe economically another year.

How much will it cost? Not so fast. In "authorizing" continuance of the plan, both Houses have said that no more than about \$5 1-2 billion can be spent on it. Will that much be spent?
