The divorce rate for England and Wales in 1947 had climbed

NEW YORK, N. Y. — World War II has left in its wake a striking world-wide increase in accumulated from previous years, as well as by the aftermath of the war." the statisticians explain. "The divorce rate in England and Wales is now about one half that in the United States, whereas 35 years ago it was only one fiftieth of our rate.

Other parts of the British Com-monwealth also show substantial increases in the frequency of divorce. In Scotland the rate for 1946 was nine times that for 1913, and for Canada, the in-crease was even somewhat great-

of Europe for which figures are available show a marked rise in divorce, with the upturn sharpest since the war. In France the rate in 1946 was double that for the year before, and almost three times that for 1944. In the neutral countries, Sweden and Switzerland, the postwar rise was

Those countries with the lowest rates in the early years of the century have recorded the largest relative increases. In Belgium, The Netherlands, and Sweden where the divorce rate formerly was low, it now is five or more times that for 1910, while in Switzerland, where the rate was higher, it is about double what it was in 1910.

"There are definite indications that the postwar peak of divorce already has been passed in a number of countries," comment the statisticians. "In the United States the rate dropped by nearly two fifths from 1946 to 1948.
Recent declines also are evident in Canada, Scotland, Denmark, and The Netherlands. It appears unlikely, however, that the di-vorce rate will return to prewar levels in the near future."

"We, therefore, the representatives of the United States of America, in general congress, assembled, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the name, and by authority of the good people of these colonies, solemnly publish and declare, that these United Colonies are, and of right ought to be free and independent states; that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain, is and ought to be totally dissolved that as free and independent states, they have full power to levy war conclude peace, contract alliances. establish commerce, and to do all other acts and things which independent states may of right do And for the support of this declarstion, with, a firm reliance on the protection of divine providence, we mutually pledge to each other our lives, our fortunes and our

sacred honor." Now, we propose to enter-into a treaty that obligates us to go into war if any one of the signatory states are involved in war. We do not even require the European states to abandon tariffs between different states as is required of our own states by our Constitution. They can continue to have barriers and tariff walls between them that is bound to get them into war. And so long as the nations in the Pact in Europe have tariff walls with other nations they are bound to remain weak and incompetent of defending incompetent of defending themselves against aggression. Thi of course means that the United States that doesn't have tariff walls between states will have to furnish the wealth and probably most of the man power to defend these statist countries who interfere with natural rights of man to trade his life energy with any person anywhere that will benefit

him the most. We will have the same say as to management of the new Compact as the country of Luxembourg, which is a much smaller state than Rhode Island. The population of Iceland is scarcely larger than Nevada and yet we are ing with Luxembourg and Iceland on the assumption of sovereign equality with the United States. Norway barely exceeds Again the size of Oregon and Italy has 80% of the area of California, and they will have equality not with each one of our states of about their same size but will have equality with the United States. When the Constitution was formed, it gave the same number of Senators to each state and Representatives in proportion to population. It seems that the Atlantic Pact pays no attention to the population or even to the amount of wealth, that each nation is supposed to furnish. In an ordinary corporation voting power is based on amount

of capital-stored up energy-invested in the enterprise. Not so with the proposed Atlantic Pact. The Pact is a denial as stated above of the principles of the Declaration of Independent, and the advice of Washington who knew from experience what tyranny and poverty and misery come from having this country under the con-trol of European countries. In an open letter to the people of the

tates Washington wrote: "Why forego the advantages of our own to stand upon foreign ground? — Why, by interweaving our destiny with that of any part of Europe, entangle our peace and prosperity in the toils of European mbition, rivalship, interest, humour or caprice?"

SOME MORE MARSHALL PLAN

RAZZLE-DAZZLE (Chicago Daily Tribune)

With the appropriation for the Marshall plan for the second year still to be acted upon by congress, the British last week made a cute little political gesture. They announced in Washington the elimination of wheat from the list of money. The bill for aid to Britain, articles to be paid for with ECA however, is to add up to the same total as before. The American taxpayer is welcome to whatever satisfaction he can draw from having his money spen for eggs, tobacco, and metal products ship-ped to Britain instead of wheat. The wheat going to Britain un-der the Marshall plan was Can-adian wheat. The American taxpayers' money used in subsidizing the British diet has been spent largely on the other side of the border. The new stems replacing wheat on Britain's ECA list are to be purchased as before in Canada, so that there will be no diminution

Mounting evidence of the glut in the American wheat market is responsible for Britain's rink-a-dink with the shopping list. The farm organizations have been sounding off about the agreement Britain signed in January with Canada covering 140 million bushels of wheat to be shipped from Montreal in the year beginning next Aug. 1. The price of \$2 set in the agreement was intended to reimbur Canada in part for grain supplied to Britain at \$1.50 to \$2 under the market a couple of years ago. Can-ada wanted \$2.50 a bushel, but the British pointed to the oversupply of grain in the United States which might make a \$2 price look ridiculous. The point was also made that padding Uncle Sam's bill too much for past favors by Canada to Britain might wake the old boy up so that he would insist upon furn-ishing his own produce.




