



Printers' Union Fights Taft-Hartley Bill

I nave just been reading a 16-page booklet issued by the International Typographical Union fighting to repeal the Taft-Hartlev Bill

The union contends it is Amer ica's oldest and most democratic labor union. It might be the oldest, but it certainly is not the most democratic, unless democracy only means that the majority has a right to rob and coerce the minority. It isn't democratic if democracy means what Walt Whitman had in mind when he said: 'I speak the pass-word primeval I give the sign of Democracy;
God! I will accept nothing which all cannot have their counterpart of on the same terms." The whole purpose of the labor unions is to deny this kind of democracy - to deny the rights of some inbased on the caste system. Whether a labor union be closed shop or union shop, they all claim that the union members need not compete with other human beings. That they, the unions, have a right to determine whether or not another human being has an equal right to do the work that they

to do They bring this into operation by their seniority rule. If a union man once gets a job, ne claims to have security, and no matter how much better another man can dd the same job the union man has the exclusive right to do that work The whole booklet is a distor-

tion of the English language. The booklet would leave the impression that labor unions could raise the permanent standard of living of the workers as a whole. They do not seem to have the faintest conception of what raises wages. They claim the labor unions have responsible for the 40-hour It does not make a particle of difference how many unions they have, they could not reduce working hours to 40 hours a week unless their members and other workers had better tools to work with. When the printers used to work long hours they practically had no tools to work with - a little bag type, a few cases, and composing stick was practically all the capital. Now they have type-setting machines that cost as high as \$15,000 apiece, and massive presses and stereotype equipment and sundry developments that en-able the worker to produce more and thus earn more. The fact of the matter is that the real standard of living for the workers as a whole would have been much higher if there had been no labor unions. This is true because labor unions retard production. And whatever retards production keeps

wages down. They boast that they have spent \$11,000,000 in strike benefits and other defensive activities against the Taft-Hartley Law. They are determined to repeal the Taft-Hartley Law and return to a complete labor monopoly. They want

to return to the caste system. I have never found any union representative who could set down labor unions with the Golden Rule or the principles set down in the Declaration of Independence or the Ten Commandments; and anything that cannot be harmonized or cannot be defended by someone who will answer questions without evasion is immoral. And whatever is immoral is uneconomic

Of course, the printers' union wants to take from the employer his right to hire or fire an individual. They want to take the management out of the hands of the owners, but don't want to fur-

nish the capital or run the risk. The publishers of newspapers who run the union label cannot tell the difference between their ideas on human relations than those of Henry Wallace or Joseph Stalin other than degree. They try with their union label to create class hatred and promote their own selfish interests. They know no law but might. That is what the printers' union label stands for.
