Answering E. Stanley Jones' Open Letter to the People Of Colorado Springs

In the last issue I was quoting from an open letter E. Stanley Jones submitted to a sister newspaper of this one at Colorado Springs, Colorado for publication, Before continuing, I want to parenthetically attempt to correct a misconception generally held that the newspaper has a great advantage in discussion over a private individual. That might be true if the newspaper did not give the opponent equal space. But even then the opposition can put the newspaper using the radio or hand bills or any competing newspaper. So the newspaper in reality has no advantage. If the newspaper gives the opponent equal space, the newspaper has / a disadvantage. The reason is this:

In the first place invariably the individual has more sympathy from the general public than does the newspaper.

In the second place if the news-

paper publishes falsehoods against

tself people are inclined to believe they are true. The newspaper can be sued for libel if it libels an op-ponent. If the newspaper publishes libelous statement against the publisher made by its opponent, it would have a mighty poor chance of getting damages from the libeler because the newspaper itself re-peated the libel. The individual might be sued, but there would be no chance of him paying damages because the individual himself gave it no direct circulation. It is the newspaper that distributes the statements and therefore it would be subject to the libel. This puts the newspaper in a very embarrassing position because if it publishes libelous matter against itself, it could get no damages against the originator of the libel because it had repeated the libel.
