

Some market analysts expressed the opinion that farmers anxious to take advantage of present price levels would hurry their big spring crop to market weeks earlier than buying presure off beef, these sources reasoned, and thus speed the marketing of feed-lot cattle which normally reaches its peak between late November and mid-December.

"In other words, the seasonal price cutting in meat that usually ecomes noticeable to the house wife in late September should be well underway shortly after Labor Day this year," said an Agriculture Department spokesman in

#### Cloud Seeding Points Way Showdown To Control of Weather

By ALTON L. BLAKESLEE
Associated Press Science Reporter

LAKE SUCCESS - (P) - Man may some day kill off thunderstorms before they lash out with atomic-bomb punch in damaging winds, rain, hail and lightning, Dr. Vincent J. Schaefer said.

Even a small thunderstorm releases energy equal to several atomic bombs, the General Electric research scientist said.

Man may also be able to create sky reservoirs of snow, and get rain or snow at times where he wants it. Fying ice patrols may keep air lanes free of icing conditions. Or planes may shoot holes into dangerous clouds ahead.

All these are possible benefits rom new studies of weather control, he told the United Nations conference on conservation and utilizatoon of resources.

Dr. Schaefer nearly three years ago found ways of producing snow or rain from certain clouds, by seeding them with dry ice, silver iodide or water.

There's no apparent way to break a drought when there are cloudless skies, or clouds with only little water in them he said.

breas of pollo should not be allowed to upset community life Suggestions by the journal of American Medical Association and the national conference on recommended practices for the control of poliomyelitis said a drastic shift from the usual routine of children "is likely to bring more trouble, than good' as far as controlling the disease is concerned.

Public and private schools should not be closed during an outbreak of poliomyelitis nor their opening delayed except for pecific reasons," the recommendations said.

"Schools to which children are transported in buses from widely separated areas or boarding schools, excluding colleges and universities, should delay opening sessions if an outbreak of poliomyelitis exists in the area where the school is located. Places of recreation and amusement need not be closed. However, attendance of children at such places should be discouraged."

The journal added that quaran-

tine has not proved valuable in preventing spread of the disease and that "reliable evilacking" on infection by water, food or sewage.
