The Sherwin-Williams Company, manufacturers of the fluid, state that one application will continue to kill insects for three to four months on inside surfaces and four to five side surfaces and four to five . weeks on outside surfaces.

of the economic and material aspects of the problem; but it is not meant to imply that these economic aspects are the only aspects or even the most important ones If Hume's views are right-and I have no evidence that they are wrong-it is important to be ever mindful that the foundations of liberty embrace the foundations of justice and morals, and of a moral civilization. The most highly prized aspects of liberty are these, and the economic welfare that develops under liberty is but a pleasant, extra dividend flowing therefrom.

If lost liberty is to be regained,

the general course to be followed simple. Liberties that have been taken away from individuals must be restored; there can be no other answer. Whether it be started with this or that liberty is a detail, however important. The way to start is to start somewhere. What conclusion can one draw

other than the hope of citizens' supervision of governmental ex-penditures of \$57 billion a year by the "democratic process" futile hope, no matter how it is attempted?


