I told him to send me the quotes and I'd take a look at them for a story. Well, they were rather explosive. Dobson not only took a crack at the Detroit front office for not having the guts to make a trade, but he was openly critical of some of his teammates.

So what do I do with the story? I know it's going to stir up trouble and create hard feelings among the players. Is it my job to worry about the welfare of the team? Or is it my Job to report what Dobson says? I wrote the story. Some

CHRISTMAS IN CUBA Christmas will be "postponed" this year in Cuba by order of Fidel Castro. The communist dictator has announced that both Christmas and New Year's celebration will be put off until next July so Cuba's workers can spend the holidays waging "a decisive battle for our future" in the sugar fields.

This announcement can be regarded only as confession of another failure by the communist regime. Sugar is the backbone of Cuba's economy, supplying 85 percent of the island's export earnings. Castro had said that the 1969-70 harvest is expected to produce enough cane for 10.3 million tons of sugar. But most sugar specialists outside Cuba have concluded that production will total not more than eight million tons.

The reasons for the lag, say the specialists, include low worker productivity, limited sugar mill capacity, inadequate much on the job and suggested that silence would bring an increase in productivity.
