WACO — (P) — The defense oday may rest its case for Ollie Otto Prince, charged with the \$15,764 robbery of the Malone State Bank on Oct. 5, 1948. The government late yesterday afternoon wound up its case against the 44-year-old Corsicana used car dealer.

Three witnesses testified that Prince was the bandit who rob-bed the Malone State Bank. The defense presented seven witnesses who testified Prince

was in or near Corsicana during the period in which the robbery was committed.

Malone.is about 34 miles from Corsicana.

Prince, already under a 10-year sentence for robbing a bank at Rice, Navarro County, is also charged with robbing a bank at Mt. Calm, Texas.

He was to have been tried on the Mt. Calm charge yesterday, but District Attorney W. H. Moursund of San Antonio decided to try the Malone case first. Witnesses in the Mf. Calm case were ordered to be on hand todav.

Guy Mann, vice president of the Malone bank, was the first witness called by the prosecution. Throughout his testimony he referred to the robber Prince.
