(Chicago Daily Tribune) The United Nations security council, with the tacit approval of the United States, has invited the Chinese Communists to sit in a U. N. discussion of the disposal of Formosa, now the stronghold of the Chiang Kai-shek national-

The actual question for discussion is a charge of aggression against the United States in Formosa, but the parliamentary actions made clear that this was the first round of the battle to seat the Chinese Reds in U. Just because a person is suffering from some physical defect does not mean that he or she does not need to earn a living. Furthermore, most people with physical handicaps can do a good job if they are placed in the right kind of work. In fact some of those who are mildly handicapped in one way or another have even done well in certain kinds of sports! Many more can enjoy themselves in active games as has been demonstrated even by those who have had an entire limb amputated.

bombardments. The institution and the men which staffed it, both before and during participation of United States in the war, made a distinguished contribution to the purposes for which it had been established.

After the war, the hospital and its equipment were turned over to Britain's Ministry of Health and it has since been used as a sort of laboratory for human guinea piga who volunteered from all over the United Kingdom to aid in the study of the common cold. From the studies made in this

institution and elewhere, a good deal has been learned about, this miserable affliction of mankind, It is now known that the cause of most, if not all, colds is a virus. At the Harvard Hospital, it was found that washings from the nose and throat taken from a person in the active stage of a cold can be diluted 100 times and if sprayed around susceptible persons would frequently produce a cold. The investigators at this hospital therefore suspect that catching a cold in ordinary life depends on receiving only a small dose of the cold virus at a time when the resistance is temporarily below standard.

In this hospital the "artificial" colds usually lasted less than a week, which is shorter than most ordinary colds, perhaps because ordinary colds are frequently followed by the invesion of secondary germs. It was also noted that the incubation period, that is the time between exposure to the infecting virus and the beginning of symptoms, was usually between two or three days.

Another interesting discovery made at this center was that the virus causing colds will live for at least two years in dry ice containers at temperatures far below freezing. Furthermore, the cold virus could be recovered after drying on a pocket handkerchief. This last suggests that many colds may be spread by the virus being shaken into the air from a- contaminated handkerchief. Also, it raises the question as to whether shaking hands by a person who has a cold will not carry the virus from one person to another.

There is still a long way to go before the disagreeable common cold will be mastered. Little by little however, the knowledge which may lead to its eventual conquest is being gathered together by painstaking studies.

The fact that so many handicapped people have performed useful work in so many kinds of occupations has helped a great deal. New methods of treatment and occupational training schedules have also successfully prepared great numbers of handicapped people to handle many different kinds of jobs well. The problem is not yet entirely solved, but further improvement is on the way.






