HOW, WHEN TO WATER GARDEN
When, how and how much to water are common questions asked by gardeners.
Watering is one of the most enjoyable aspects of home
gardening but it is also one of the most misunderstood. Misuse gardening but itis also one of the most misunderstood. Misus of water in your home garden often causes many problems,
among them soil crusting, poor root growth, blossom drop cracked fruit, nutrient deficiencies and various types of plan diseases.
Regardless of how you water your garden, remember to
apply sufficient water to wet the soil to a depth of at least apply sufficient water to wet the soil to a depth of at least 6
inches. How often to water will depend upon climatic onditions, rate of growth, sef marden, Check the soil, not the plants, to determine when to wate your garden. Looking at plants for symptoms such as wilting for many reasons, such as diseases, too much fertilizer, heat or perhaps too much water. If soil is relatively moist an inch or so deep, you don't need to water. Remember, heavy soils will Most gardeners water by flooding or furrow irrigation. For his method to be effective, it's best to have plants on raised beds so water can go between them. With flood or furro Watering with a sprinkler is probably the most convenien method. However, with our salty lake water, Pampa residents should never water with a sprinkler. When using a sprinkler. turn it on early enough in the day to alow foliage to dry off before nighttime. Wet foliage in
combination of cool nighttime temperatures often results in
serious serious types of foliage diseases.
Drip or trickle irrigation is a rleatively new concept which is
gaining popularity. This type of syste gaining popularity. This type of system literally drops water
onto the soil surface near plants so that it seeps soil. This method is much more efficient than either furrow or overhead watering although the initial cost is high. However,
being more efficient. these systems generally pay for Chemselves within a short period of time. Paying attention to how, how much and when you water can
make the difference between success or failure of your garden.
VINES FOR PATIO SHADE

The quetion is: what can you do right now about the intense
heat and outrageous air conditioning bills you'll soon face The easiest quickest solution to this patio problem is tc buid a simple but sturdy overhead structure and plant annual vinés along the sides for quick summer shade. Being annuals, thes vines will fourish and provide welcome shade during the allowing maximum sunlight penetration to help warm your home during the winter months.
Uses for annual vines are numerous and varied. You can use
them to decoarate a barren wall in matching colors, soften the hem to decoarate a barren wall in matching colors, soften the
vere lines of brick or stone fences, twine around an empt birdfeeder, or add a rustic note to trellis, wood fence o Unspou
Unsightly views can be hidden easily by covering a ready made trellis with quick-growing annual vines.
These vines have delicate the structures on which they climb. The annual vinses does ave the holdfasts often associated with their perennial counterparts. Thus they won't damage brick, mortar or wood. The thunbergia or black - eyed Susan vine flowers in yellow bright oranges or maize and white, most with a dark cente
eye. The heart -shaped, medium-green foliage will take eye. The heart - shaped, medium- green foliage will take a
decided back seat to the cascades of flowers provided during the warm months ahead.
Thunbergias can be trained to a low trellis or fence where hey will climb gracefully to a maximum height of six fee good job covering a patio; try morning glory or moon vine for this purpose).
All thunbegias require an average garden soil, some protection from gearing heat nd a deep watering once a week.
Keep an eye out for spider mites, however, and treat romptly if detected.) Still another advantage of this vine is it olerance of very light shade.
Other annual vines which are super performers include morning glories and moon vines. Both are extremely easy to grow from seed w
lace it's needed. The night-time beauty and fragrance of moon vines is a rea addition to your summer landscape.
