#### Abstract

Recent rains have added insult to injury to wheat farms east of Pampa. The Wallace Birkes operation was one of the worst hit in last month's twisters, which destroyed five buildings and damaged five others on their four farms 20 miles east of Pampa in the Laketon area, and recent rains may not make a harvest possible

The worst damage there, Birkes said, was from the hail that accompanied the tornadoes. He said the hail that accompanied the tornadoes. centuries, it berame very powerful."
