## County maintains old road that now leads to private home

| BY JEFF LANGLEY <br> Staff Writer $\qquad$ authorized the use of county materials and county equipment and crews this week to maintain what appears to be a private drive to a new house, about 11 miles south of Pampa <br> But McCracken said the drive is actually the original between Groom and Lefors that was heavily traveled for many years <br> The house, listed at Star Route 2. Box 190, is owned by Howard Reed and the land is owned by Elmer Mitton. according to county records and McCracken. <br> According to Gray County Judge Carl Kennedy and the Texas Attorney General's Office, it is against the law to use county equipment and supplies on private property. <br> The private drive leads from FM 749, right up to the garage of the home. <br> A source told The Pampa News that two Precinct 3 county dump trucks and crews began dumping loads of caliche gravel on the drive about $\mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. Tuesday. The dumping continued for about eight hours Wednesday. and county road graders 1 p.m. Thursday. All told. county crews and equipment worked on the drive about approximately 90 loads of caliche gravel were used on the drive <br> Judge Kennedy said, "As a general work on private roads - no grading. or anything. It is against state law. If somebody used (county) equipment on somebody's driveway, that is not supposed to be done <br> However. Kennedy said if a school bus makes a stop at a country house. a drive might be considered a public road. <br> The Texas Attorney General's reference to the old Texas Penal Code. providing for a prison term for misapplication of county property and equipment equipment. | Kennedy explained that each county precinct maintains its own county barn and road equipment and crews. The judge said each commissioner authorizes road work to be done indset precinct. and each submits a budget for the fiscal year's road and bridge work. The separate budgets are paid out of the county's total road and bridge fund. The road and bridge funds come from the county's property taxes and from the sale of license plates. <br> In addition to the dump trucks and blades, county pickups and rollers were used on the driveway, which the house <br> McCracken said he authorized the work. Asked if the driveway work ran all the way to the house's garage. McCracken said. "in that vicinity. yeah. <br> Asked if there were legal provisions for the county's performing the work. McCracken said. "That's really kind of an old road there that had been maintained for about 20 years. These people came in there and built a new home. so I was doing a little work rebuilding that old road there. You know they couldn't get in or out:" <br> Informed the road appeared to be a private drive, the commissioner said, "You could pretty near call it that, I guess. There was an old road there, and it had some caliche on it <br> Asked how much each load of caliche cost the county, he replied, load, I don't know. I'm probably going to let those people pay for the whole works there I imagine I will let those people (Reed) pay for the dirt Asked if the county provided the said, "Yeah, when we're caught we just kind of maintain the road there." "Sometimes, it's kind of hard to tell what you call private and what's not when you get out here in the pasture. McCracken said | The commissioner said every person who builds a new home in the county has a right to a road to the property. McCracken acknowledged road, but "there is nothing in writing about deeds and easements on any county road <br> McCracken denied that the driveway the county surfaced joins with Reed's garage door ."We lack a little getting to their garage door. They have a stretch of red dirt hauled in there from their garage out to approximately where a street or road might be, and I imagine they will cement that eventually. You know. I some motor grader operator might knock the corner off their house." nuclear war from ever breaking out. And that depends on peopple kxowing

Perhaps this Pernaps this city would be entirely

But perhaps not Some might survive if not here, then elsewhere.
We can't be sure. And when you're
ot sure. yu take measures you can. That is only
sensible. It doesst mean that you
underestimate underestimate the kind of
catastrophe a total nuclear war
would cause: it simply means that you refuse to give up all hope of
survival. Shelters might work in some circumstances. Evacuation
might be possible for some peopple.
You say we will die. I say I hope some can survive.
Junior: And I would be the first to try to evacuate my wife and baby.
But where would they go? A nuclear
attack would not only destroy people
