# **Outnumbered Allies Hold Positions**

## Four Nations Total Economic Mobilization Pledge Troops May Be Needed, Truman Says To Help U.S.

LONDON - (P) - Britain nounced today she has decided t send ground troops into Korea. The British admiralty earliet disclosed plans to put the far eastern freet on a "full scale war footing" immediately.

The decision to back up American GIs in Korea with British soldiers was made public by Defense Minister Emanuel Shinwell in the House of Commons

Shinwell told the House "The government today notified the United Nations we are pre-pared to send to Korea an etfective land reinforcement, includ ing infantry, armor, artillery and engineers, together with the administrative backing required to malatain it.

ANKARA, Turkey P. Turkey has offered 4.500 fully armed troops to fight the Communists in Korea.

Officials said these men would not be a token force, but a trained hard-hitting military unit. They would be equipped with American arms received under the current U. S. military an program.

The decision to offer troops was made in an emergency cabinet session yesterday.

## **Red Pressure** Is Heavy in Pusan Area

TOKYO, Thursday -(AP)-Outnumbered American and South Korean troops clung stubbornly to defense positions Wednesday in the face of "heavy pressure" along all fronts, General MacArthur's headquarters said today.

A field report indicated that the embattled defenders may have recaptured Hadong, only 70 miles by air west of the major American supply port of Pusan, after furious air strikes left the city ablaze. Headquarters of the United Nations commander in Tokyo, in a release issued at 12:50 a. m. (8:50 a.m. Wednesday, CST), said the first cavalry division had repulsed a number of North Korean attacks on the Yongdong ront in the center of the detense lines. The Reds hurled waves of tanks and infantry in an effort to overwhelm the defenders.



Now the unquestionable right of any citizen in a democratic country is the right to gripe and moan when they think s thing is wrong. I firmly believe that holds true in regards to umpiring and officiating. . .but hardly to the extent it has now reached all over the country.

Our umpiring has not been up to the standards this year that it should have been, although the officials do seem to be improving. But whether it is or it isn't, is not the question at hand. People are actually looking for something, to gripe about, and if they don't find a legal excuse. . . they find one of their own.

It is almost cer-Hitler's ghost is back with us. tainly not caused by a vitamin deficiency. There are several helpful treatments but no absolute cures. So far as I know penicillin is of no value.
