



At first about all that could be done was to drain or destroy-the breeding places for mosquitoes by they breed, spraying oily, substances over the surface, and measures of a similar nature.

Paris gréen came along a little later. Other insect-killing substances like pyrethrum have been Improved in their killing powers. From the standpoint of the battle against insects World War II was a great success; better chemicals were badly needed and D.D.T. was one of the results of the intensive studies carried out at that time.

D.D.T. is not perfect in all respects-for example house flies which are exposed to it gradually become resistant. Consequently the search goes on for new and better insect killers.

But it is not diseases alone which make insects our enemies the ordinary mosquito bite is uncomfortable enough. The reaction to mosquito bites is not always alike. In some people a bite will cause swelling and severe itching. while in others the reaction is slight and lasts only a short time.

When the mosquito bites, it probably pushes something into the skin but just what this substance is is still a matter of debate. It is generally believed to be similar to the chemical which bees inject when they sting.

There have been tries at making extracts from the mosquito in an attempt to create resistance or immunity in people. These trials, however, have not been wholly successful.

HARDLY WORTH IT

Even if a satisfactory substance could be discovered and prepared for this purpose, the resistance probably would not last very long and would have to be repeated each year and usually would not be worth the effort.

Hundreds of kinds of spiders are found in the Americas, but apparently only one, known as the black widow spider, is likely to produce severe symptoms by biting. This is a shiny coal-black spider, usually marked with bright red or yellow or both. The female is the one responsible for the bites.

The salve is a new chemical a kin of the drug colchicine, made from the autumn crocus plant The new cousin of colchicine is 10 times more potent, Lettre told the fifth International Cancer Research Congress.

Some breast cancers treated with the new drug disappeared and had not returned three years later, Dr. Lettre said. But because they still might return, they could not be considered cured, he added.

Lettre, from the Institute for Experimental Cancer Research at Heidelberg, said the colchicine chemical had been used since 1942 on 50 women with breast cancer. Results on most, how-ever, were not known because he lost track of them during war. The new drug, n-methyl-col-



### Sun Glasses **Protect Eyes**

Sunglasses are necessary to prevent a loss in your eye's sen-sitivity to light, says Dr. Robert H. Peckham, associate professor of research opthamology at Temple University. Dr. Peckham, who was a member of the Army-Navy Vision Committee during the war, says that "this loss of sitivity to light results in a drop in visual acuity - sharpness of seeing - particularly at night." 


