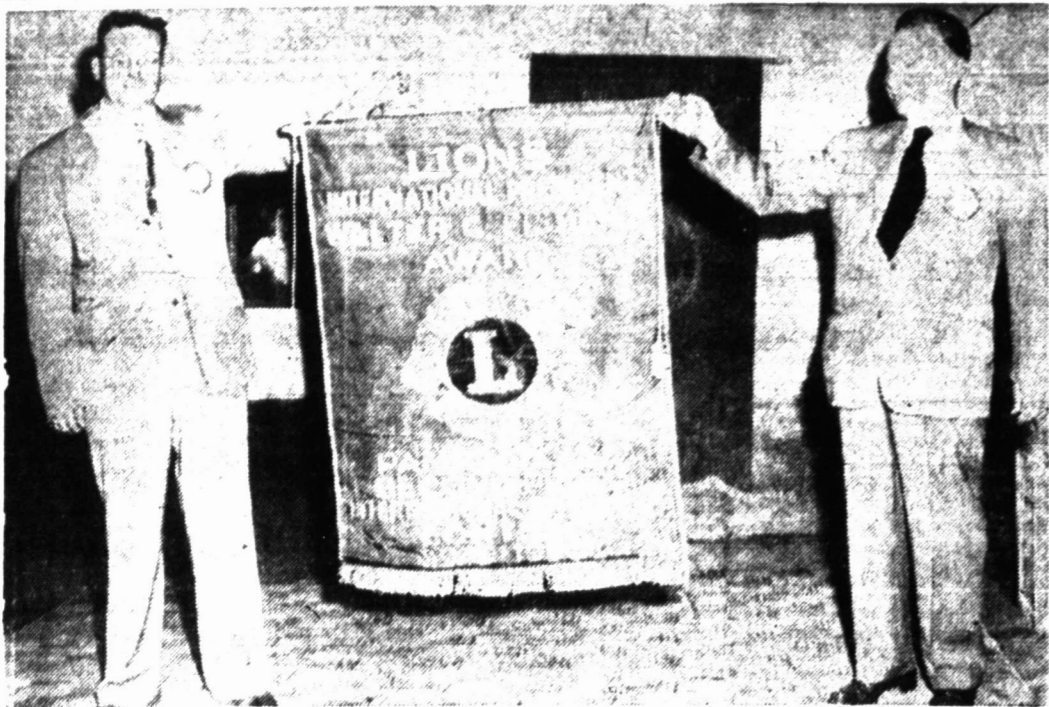

Shivers spoke at a hometown rally at Woodville in the Texas piney woods. The speech lasted six minutes. "This is no time for a campaign of personal abuse," he said. He added that he has never believed "in trying to match the wild-eyed promises of political opportunists."

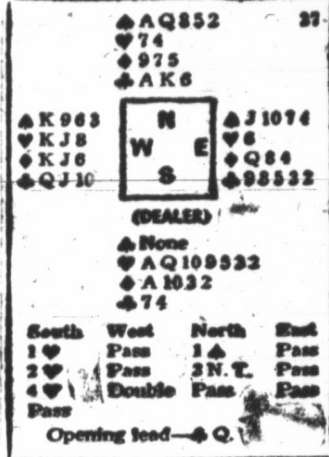
**JACOBY ON BRIDGE**

**Dummy's Ace Bait  
Lou's Discard Trap**

"I'm getting so forgetful," apologized Larceny Lou, "that sometimes I can't even remember my own name."  
"People like you usually have a number instead of a name," West observed sourly. "I don't know how you manage to stay out of jail!"  
As usual, the cause of this outburst was a bridge hand. Lou had managed to swindle both opponents at once by the same play!  
West opened the queen of clubs, and dummy won with the king. Lou naturally led a trump from the dummy, finessing the nine from his own hand. West's penalty double had made it clear that the king of trumps was badly located, but Lou still hoped to find the jack favorably placed. As it happened, however, West

was able to win the second trick with the jack of trumps. He returned the jack of clubs, and dummy won with the ace.  
At this point Lou executed his little swindle. He merely led dummy's remaining trump and finessed the queen from his own



hand. He could never get back to dummy again, and he had "absent-mindedly" left the ace of spades in dummy without taking it!

West naturally won the second trump finesse with the king, and returned the ten of clubs. Lou ruffed the third round of clubs and led three rounds of trumps. This left him with one trump and four diamonds. Each of the other players had to reduce to a holding of five cards.

West looked fearfully at the dummy, which had saved all of the spades. He was sure that South had at least one spade, and it never occurred to West that Lou had left the ace of spades in the dummy without a spade in his own hand. West was sure, therefore, that he had to have two small spades with his king to have any chance at all for a trick in that suit. He was therefore able to save only two diamonds.

East was equally certain that South had at least one spade in his hand. Since his partner had already discarded one spade, East felt sure that it was up to him to save at least three spades to the jack-ten to make sure that the whole suit could not be brought in. Hence East also discarded a diamond.

This was all that Larceny Lou needed. Since each opponent had discarded a diamond, Lou was able to lay down the ace of diamonds and lead another diamond, thus clearing the entire suit. He was able to take the last three tricks—with his remaining trump and the two established diamonds.

It is important to note that if Lou had cashed the ace of spades to discard a diamond, the whole situation would have been clear to the opponents. Each of them would hold diamonds, and South would have lost two trumps and two diamonds with absolute certainty.

NEW YORK — Not by any state or federal law, but by a decision of certain judges whose personal motives I assert my right to ponder, our courts nowadays protect Communists and fellow-travelers from denunciation by loyal citizens.

Yes, I do charge that communism is a criminal conspiracy against my country in the interests of the enemy who is killing American young men in Korea.

But my word is not law and the law, as interpreted by attorneys, general and the courts, holds that everyone has a right to be a Communist or fellow-traveler. The law does not even criticize a Communist or fellow-traveler except to a faint degree in excluding them from certain public jobs. So why are these federal judges so fastidious in protecting Communists and fellow-travelers?

In this case, the unfortunate loyal American did not even go so far as to express an opinion that the plaintiffs were Communists or fellow-travelers in so many words or in substance. The language that she did use is now being remanded to the Supreme Court by the high court.

That is a remarkable achievement in the light of the fact that the industry, in meeting an all-time record demand had had to expand its facilities enormously and had had to pay the going high prices for labor and materials. One reason for it is all a elaborate research program.

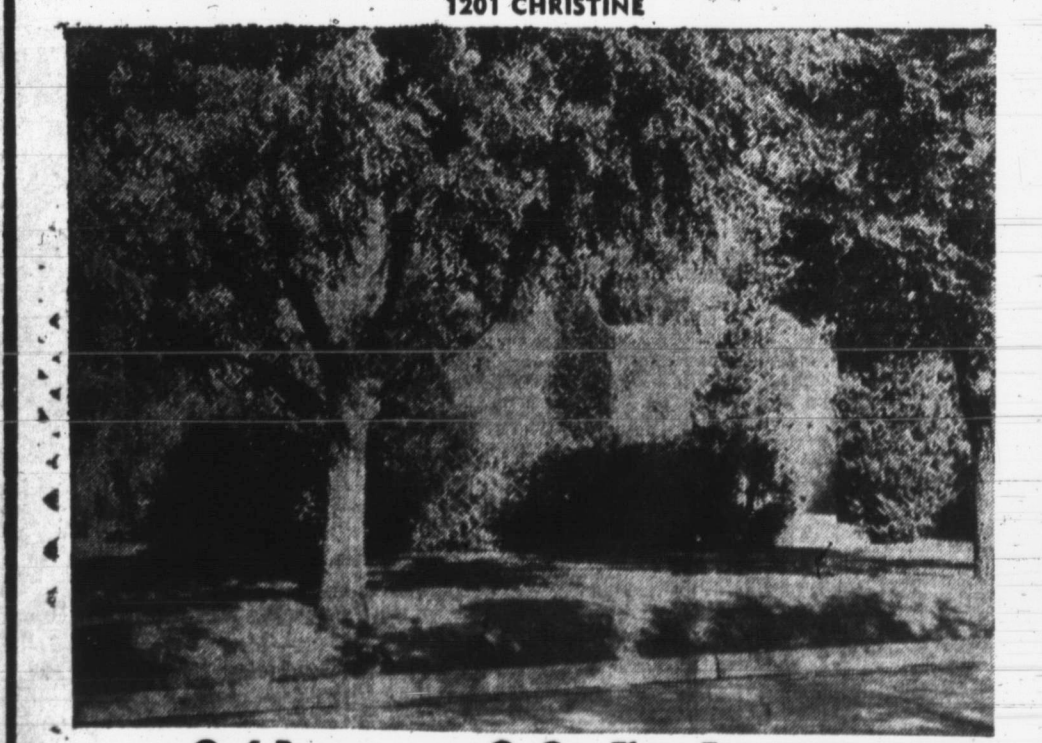

# Solon Thinks Gang Action in Kansas Quiet Since Probe

KANSAS CITY (AP) — Did the Binaggio-Gargotta gangland slayings put the brakes on big-time gambling in Kansas City?

Sen. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn), head of the Senate crime investigating committee, says testimony taken during a two-day hearing here, shows gambling operations are pretty well closed down now.

But before the slayings last April 5 gambling operations were on a larger scale than in St. Louis, he added.

Charles Binaggio, northside political leader and gambling figure, and Charles Gargotta, his henchman, were shot to death in their Democratic headquarters. Their slayings have not been solved.

Former associates of Binaggio and Gargotta were among those questioned.

"Before the murders there seems to have been a general absence of strong law enforcement in the city and apparently it was somewhat worse in the county outside the city," Kefauver said.

He said no information of value had been developed on the slayings.

The committee has questioned James Pendergast, a Democratic faction leader and a friend of President Truman. Pendergast is a nephew of the late Kansas City political boss, Tom Pendergast.

Pendergast told reporters he was not quizzed on gambling.

He said he told the committee in response to a question that he had no idea who killed Binaggio and Gargotta. He also said he was asked about the theft of ballots from the courthouse in 1947 during a vote fraud investigation and that he told the committee he had no idea who committed the theft.

The committee held hearings in Miami, Fla., and St. Louis before coming to Kansas City.

# Moscow Press and Radio Says U.S. Prepares for 3rd War

MOSCOW (AP) — Moscow's press and radio gave top play today to President Truman's message to Congress and declared it proved America is laying the groundwork for World War III.

The report, carried in a Tass dispatch from Washington, said "Truman admits the United States is strengthening its preparations for war, both in Europe and on the American continent."

The Soviet news agency dispatch said "Truman on July 20 sent a message to Congress in which he called for measures which are designed to broaden the scale of American aggression in Korea and other places and are pushing the U.S.A. along the path of mobilization for war."

"In his message," Tass said, "Truman tries to picture United States aggression in Korea as a 'peace mission of the U.S.A.'"

"Trying to justify openly aggressive acts of the United States in Korea," the dispatch continued, "Truman refers to the illegal decisions of the Security Council of June 25 and June 27 and July 7, adopted, as it is well known, in violation of the U. N. statutes."

(Tass referred to the council's condemnation of the Northern Korean invasion of South Korea, and its call for military support of the South Koreans.)

The United States president, Tass said, ignored the reaction of the world's progressive public, and

# Potent Salve Aids in Fight With Cancer

By ALTON L. BLAKESLEE

PARIS (AP) — A potent new salve has made some breast cancer disappear. Dr. Hanes Lettre of Heidelberg, Germany, has reported.

The salve is a new chemical, a kin of the drug colchicine, made from the autumn crocus plant. The new cousin of colchicine is 10 times more potent, Lettre told the fifth International Cancer Research Congress.

Some breast cancers treated with the new drug disappeared and had not returned three years later, Dr. Lettre said. But because they still might return, they could not be considered cured, he added.

Lettre, from the Institute for Experimental Cancer Research at Heidelberg, said the colchicine chemical had been used since 1912 on women with breast cancer. Results at most, however, were not known because he had lost track of them during the war.

The new drug, n-methyl-colchisamide, stops cancer cells from dividing or reproducing if it catches them at the middle phase of this activity, he explained.

Laboratory studies have showed the drug is not effective if it reaches living cells before, or after that critical time.

Sending a slight electric current through the tumor after the salve is applied makes the drug enter deeper into the cancer, he said. This same effect was noted with other drugs.

Colchicine and its new cousin are poisonous drugs with bad effects on healthy tissues as well as on cancerous ones. Both have to be used cautiously.

The drug must be used for long periods of time to get good results in halting cancer growth, Lettre said.

Dick Romney of the mountain states conference said the rules requiring more careful use of the hands and arms would keep players from knocking out teeth and bruising Adam's apple. A study of motion pictures of games, he said, showed that numerous injuries last season were caused by unnecessary rough stuff.

Romney cited these changes as particularly vital to play:

(1) On offensive blocking, the teammate of a runner must keep his hands and arms below the shoulders of an opponent during the entire block.

(2) On defensive holding, when the hand or arm is used by the opponent of a runner, the hand must be in advance of the elbow; that is, first contact must be made with the hand.

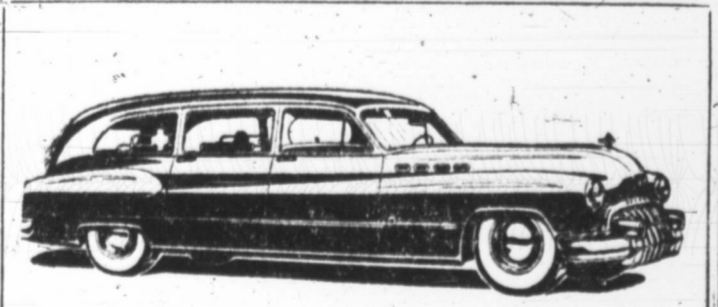

## Sun Glasses Protect Eyes

If you've been getting frequent headaches this summer, and attributing them to heat, hard work or diet deficiency, you'd better check your eyes. Perhaps you've been using them a lot in bright sunlight without the protection of sunglasses.

Sunglasses are necessary to prevent a loss in your eye's sensitivity to light, says Dr. Robert H. Peckham, associate professor of research ophthalmology at Temple University. Dr. Peckham, who was a member of the Army-Navy Vision Committee during the war, says that "this loss of sensitivity to light results in a drop in visual acuity — sharpness of seeing — particularly at night." It is greatest the night after exposure to sunlight which uses up the visual purple — a chemical on the retina of the eye that is needed if you are to see — faster than the eye can restore it normally.

Researchers have found that whenever you are out in the bright sun for an extended time between the hours of 11 a. m. and 4 p. m. in the northern zones and between 10 a. m. and 4 p. m. in southern zones, you should wear glasses. It is possible to lose from 50 to 90 percent of night vision ability after prolonged unprotected exposure. The National Safety Council states that two-thirds of the automobile accidents occur after dark — many of these due to people with reduced "night vision."

Dr. Peckham says it is not necessary to buy expensive sunglasses — he claims the inexpensive glasses are just as effective and will not affect normal vision. He has determined that the density of color is the most important factor in sunglasses, since the purpose is to reduce the glare of reflected sunlight and in some cases, artificial light.

Sun glasses vary according to the purpose, he explains. During the war the Navy chose dark grey, the Army different shades of green and the Air Force brown-grey and sage green. Dr. Peckham suggests greenish yellow, yellowish-green or blue-green lenses for flying and the beach; brownish grey lenses for mountain-climbing, skiing or snow-shoeing; flesh-colored and "smoker" lenses for people such as green-eyed redheads who are hyper-sensitive to sunlight. Amber lenses are effective around beaches and for flying but should never be used while driving since they distort color perception of traffic lights. Sun glasses should never be worn at night.

**LUNCHEON DISH**  
A quick and easy luncheon dish for hot weather is to add finely diced celery to canned kidney beans along with a little chopped pickle and salad dressing, served on lettuce or romaine. Rinse the beans with cold water, after taking them from the can, and drain before making the salad.

**NUTRITIOUS DRINK**  
For a nutritious cool drink put an egg white, a few tablespoons of orange juice and a can of apricots with farina in a jar with a tight-fitting cover; shake until well mixed but not foamy. Pour over ice and serve to one thirsty person.

Next time you make a sauce of canned sour red pitted cherries and their syrup, flavor it with a few grains of nutmeg and some whole cloves. This sauce is delicious on rice, tapioca, or cottage pudding.

### Samuel, a Child of Prayer

In the story of Samuel, the child born in answer to his mother's earnest prayer and dedicated to the service of God, there are some elements, that are seldom, if ever, mentioned.

I like to think, for instance, of Elkanah, Samuel's father, and the husband of Hannah, who never knew a man called Elkanah, though many men have been called by less honorable Biblical names.

Elkanah stands as a conspicuous example of the good husband and devoted lover. According to the custom of the time he had two wives. When childless Hannah was disconsolate because of the reproach and all treatment of the other wife, who had children, Elkanah, finding her weeping and not eating, said to her: "Why is thy heart grieved? Am not I better to thee than ten sons?"

Surely there spoke the voice of true love. What joy, therefore, when Hannah's prayers for a child were answered with the birth of Samuel. Hannah made good her vow, and the child in the temple, serving the High Priest Eli, began a great career as High Priest, prophet, and leader in Israel.

The times were difficult, calling for a leader of strength, courage, and of high integrity. Eli was not an exemplary father and his sons had grown up in unrestrained evil, bringing corruption and licentiousness into the very offices of religion. The establishment of righteousness, and the purging of evil, was absent from the very temple itself.

Morgover, the times were of great danger, and Samuel came to leadership in an hour of overwhelming disaster for Israel. The sons of Eli were both killed by battle as the Philistines completely routed the armies of Israel. Eli died when he learned of his sons' deaths.

How Samuel rallied Israel, and wrested victory from defeat is told in Samuel 7, with the incident establishing the symbol, Ebenezer, and the saying, "Hitherto hath the Lord helped us."

Unfortunately, Samuel's sons followed in the corrupt ways of the sons of Eli. Angered, the people demanded a new king. Disheartened by this virtual rejection at the end of a great career, Samuel acceded to their demands, and Saul became king. But the life and work of Samuel as a leader in Israel were unsullied by any unworthiness. He was a true priest, an honest prophet, and a fearless and courageous leader. He gave evidence of a vigor and intensity in action of which the gentle life of the child in the temple gave little suggestion.

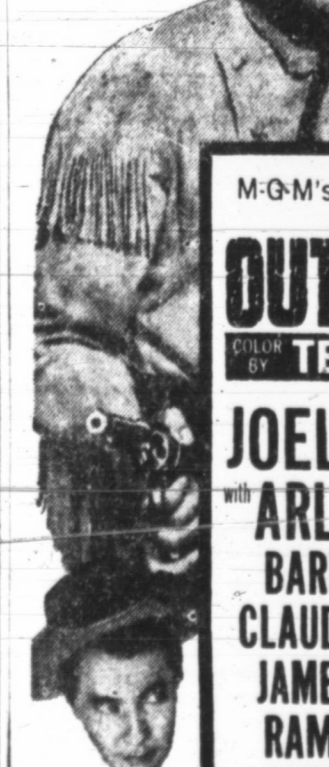

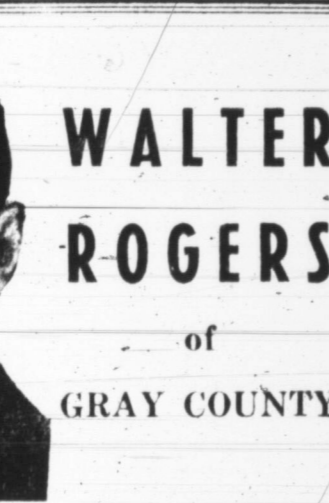

**Damage, Injuries High in Ohio Towns Beat by Tornadoes**

LIMA, Ohio — (AP) — Twin tornadoes slashed through two western Ohio communities last night, ripping roofs off at least 30 homes, damaging about 270 others, and injuring 30 persons. No one was killed, and no serious injuries were reported.

First reports indicated damage in Lima — where the high winds cut an eight-block wide swath — would be at least \$1,350,000. Damage to power company facilities was expected to add another \$500,000 to the figure. There was no immediate estimate of damage in the rural Van Wert area, 27 miles to the northwest.

The first tornado struck near that community of 10,000 lifting the entire Bethel Methodist church building into the sky and ripping off roofs of four barns. The church was demolished.

About 30 minutes later, the second tornado swept through northwestern Lima, a city of about 50,000. Red Cross officials said several hundred persons were left temporarily homeless.

Power lines were hit, and the entire city was dark until nearly midnight. A volunteer unit of nearly 400 veterans, National Guardsmen, and Army and Navy reservists patrolled the city, to guard against looting.

**Red Registration in Texas Sought**

SAN ANTONIO — (AP) — A bill to outlaw the Communist party in Texas will be introduced in the Legislature next January if the state has jurisdiction, Rep. Marshall O. Bell of Bexar County said yesterday. He said he would ask legislation requiring Communists to register with the Texas Department of Public Safety and report any change of address.
