
Truman Asks 10 Billion to Halt Reds; Fresh Yank Forces Swarm Into Korea

The first step in the treatment of poliomyelitis is to make the diagnosis as early as possible.

ways easy because the disease really begins several days before there are any signs of paralvsis. Also the symptoms dur-

ing this early stage are often like those of an ordinary cold or mild infection. At this point it ought to be emphasized that a good many people never get any paralysis at all.

As soon as a definite case has been discovered the other members of the family should be examined. When the diagnosis of polio has been made the patient usually should be treated in the hospital because the best results are obtained when the medical care, nursing, physical therapy, and other treatments are readily available as they are in most hos-The patient with polio who de-

velops trouble with breathing requires special treatment with a respirator or iron lung. Of course, this is a serious complication, but many recover completely, often without any paralysis at

No two victims of polio are exactly alike. Experience, judgment, and skill are required to get the best results from treatment. The physician, of course, should be in general charge of the measures which are undertaken Rest, relaxation, and muscular

training later are important. Proper nursing care is invaluable as are measures to combat the muscle spasm which accompanies the early stages of poliomyelitis. For the latter purpose, the hot

wet packs which have been so successfully employed and publicized by Miss Elizabeth Kenny have proved of great benefit. They help to relieve the pain and skin tenderness which often accompanies the disease. When poliomyelitis strikes it is

important first that the patient be put to bed as soon as possible. A person who has an acute illness, especially at a time when poliomyelitis is around, should be placed in bed at once, regardless of how trivial the illness may appear to be. DON'T TEMPT FATE

An attack of indigestion, a flead cold, fever or headache, may mean that the disease is developing. People who have tried to continue normal activity after the appearance of such warning signs run the risk of developing the disease in a more serious form

The treatment of early poliomyelitis has already much improved and will doubtless continue to do so. To get the best regulte everyone ch alert for early symptoms and should get attention right away if suspicious signs develop. Dr. Jordan will answer ques

Evangeline Booth, Retired Salvation Army Head, Dies

HARTSDALE, N. Y. — (P) — General Evangeline Booth, retired commander of the worldwide Salvation Army, died yes-terday at the age of 84.

She had been ill for more than a year and spent the last few days before her death in a coma. She was born in London on Christmas Day, 1865, the same vear her father, General William Booth, founded the Army, She grew up with the organization and her lifetime almost exactly paralleled its growth. As a little child she followed

her father's footsteps as he preached in the Limehouse and Whitechapel slums of London and was preaching there herself

when only in her teens.

Later she carried the Army's work into Canada and the United States. As head of the Army's Canadian division she led a mis sion to the Klondike gold rush camps in 1898. Later she became an American citizen and was leader of the Army in the United States for 30 years. In 1934 she was elected commander of the world organization,

and retired in 1939. She was the Army's first woman general.


