

UNANSWERED QUESTIONS ABOUT KOREA

(The Chicago Daily Tribune) Some questions about the Korean war that people are asking and their officials in Washington should be answering:

What do we do after we have pushed the North Koreans back across the 38th parallel? Do we follow them with a view to destroying their offensive power and so preventing a repetition of the attack? Do we intend to garrison all of Korea or, perhaps, only South Korea with American troops for the indefinite future? If so, about how many will be required, what will it cost, and why didn't we keep a garrison there in the first place?

Is the sending of American troops to Korea to be regarded (a) as a precedent for defending all independent states from any aggressor; or (b) as a precedent for defending against soviet aggression only; or (c) as not a precedent for anything? The answer cannot be that it is the policy of the United States to cooperate with U. N. in resisting aggression, for U. N. acted in this case after the United States' policy had been announced.


