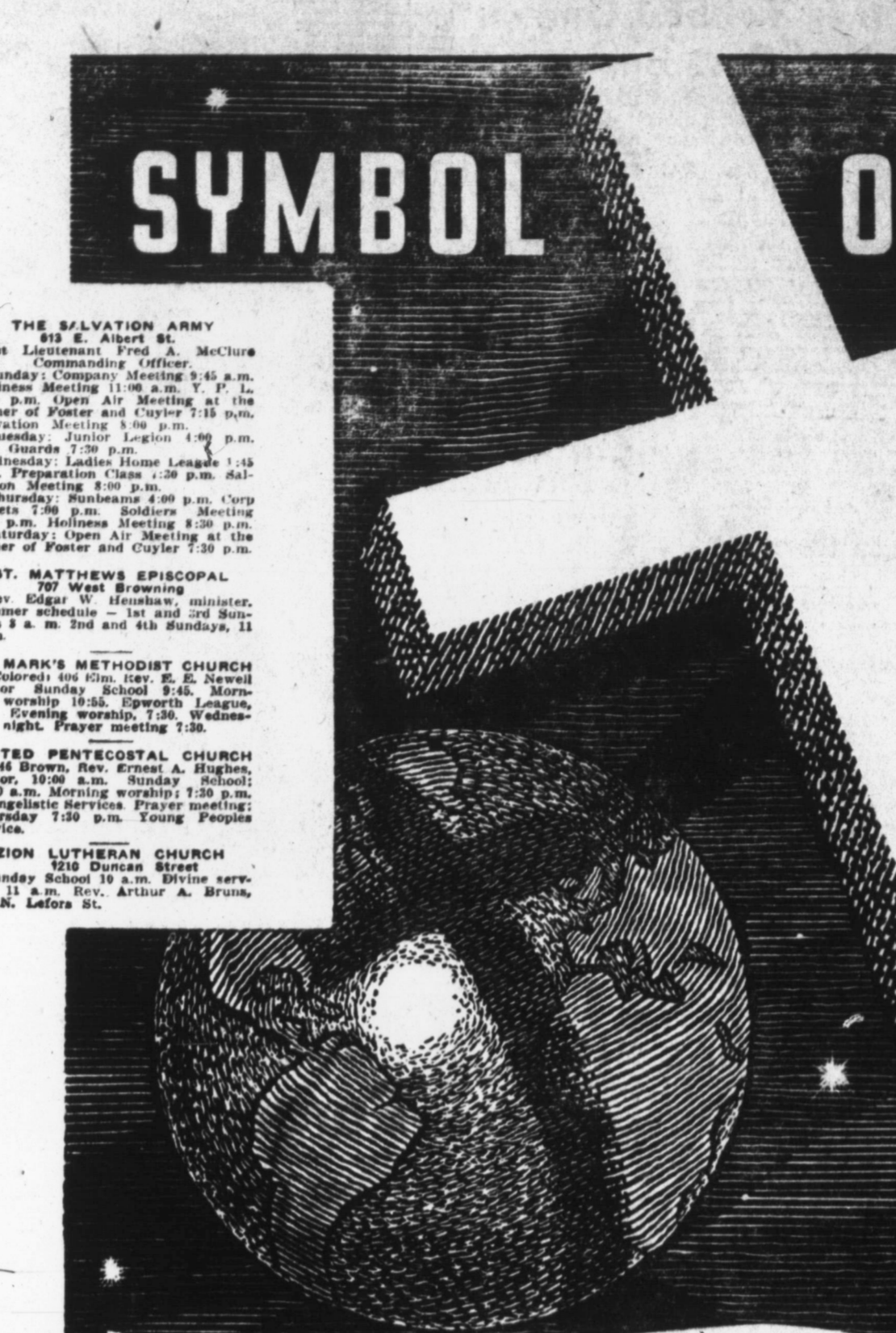

"Unreality" is the subject of the Lesson-Sermon which will be read in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, October 1.

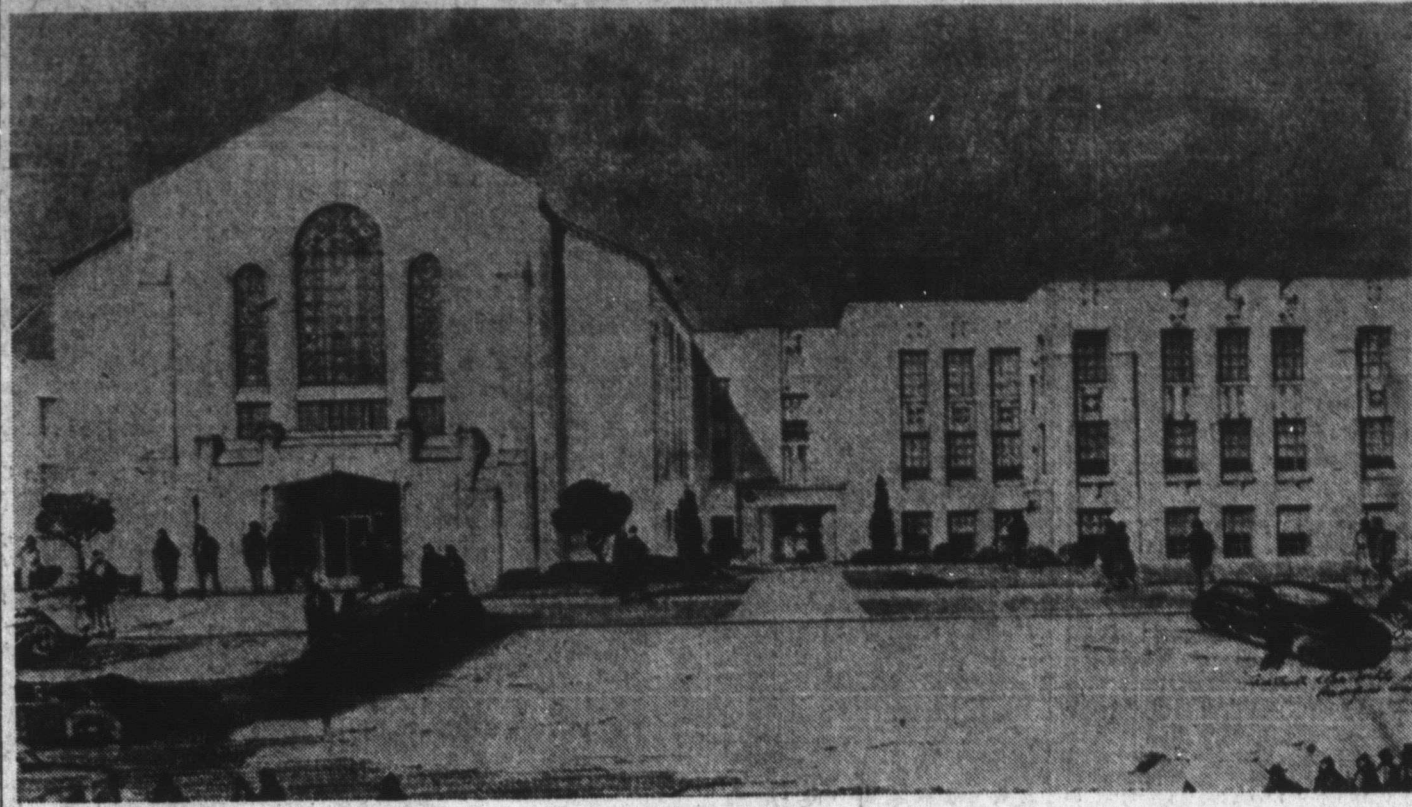
The Golden Text is: "What is the chaff to the wheat? saith the Lord" (Jeremiah 23:28).

Pampa First Baptist Church Among First to Organize on Plains



The First Baptist Church of Pampa was among the first churches to organize on the plains frontier and was one of the outgrowths of the all-denominational meetings that were held when Pampa was still unsettled.

Now, this church has one of the largest memberships in the city, with a resident membership of 2,369 and 1,920 enrolled in the Sunday School. This includes the Hobart Street Mission, which is sponsored by the First Church.

The Rev. E. Douglas Carver is the present pastor of the church and R. Virgil Mott is music and education director of all departments.

In 1908, about 10 members of the Baptist Church were attending services in a school house here, which was a small gathering of all denominations. These 10 people managed to organize and called in, as their pastor, a Rev. Whately, who was pastoring in Miami.

Among these charter members were Mr. and Mrs. E. C. Barrett, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Barrett, Mr. and Mrs. Baker Henry, Mr. and Mrs. W. D. Benton, Judge and Mrs. D. R. Henry, L. G. Roberts and Mrs. Robert Williams.

By 1914, the group had grown strong enough to erect a concrete block church, which was located where the present Combs-Worley Building is situated. The pastor then was the Rev. Barker, who was followed by a Rev. Parks. The Rev. C. E. Lancaster, who became a chaplain in World War I, returned to the Pampa church after serving in the army.

The Rev. Lancaster was followed by the Rev. H. R. Whately, no relation to the previous pastor, and the father of Herman Whately and Calvin Whately, who are still members of the church and both serve on the board of deacons.

Succeeding the Rev. Whately was the Rev. E. A. Tippin, and D. H. Truhitte, followed by the Rev. Lancaster, who came to

What It Means to Be a Christian

To the seemingly simple question, "What does it mean to be a Christian?" many answers have been given.

I heard of one young woman, who when asked by an evangelist whether she were a Christian, replied that she was. But she told a friend afterwards: "Of course I wasn't a Christian in the sense that he meant; but I belonged in a Christian land. I am not a pagan, so I must be a Christian."

More reprehensible, in fact, than the attitude of certain public officials in Germany before both world wars. A symptom of the corruption that was eating at the heart of that great land was a condition of office requiring all officials to be Christian communicants. Some of these officials, though actually rationalists or even atheists, met this condition by formally taking communion once a year—a blasphemous recognition of the most sacred of Christian rites.

Other answers to the question, though less reprehensible, are nonetheless mistaken. To be a Christian, it might be said, it is only necessary to belong to a Christian church, or to one of the many denominations professing Christian faith and organization.

On the contrary, some might be considered Christians who belonged to no church at all.

Few, for instance, would deny that Abraham Lincoln was a Christian, and a very good one. Yet Lincoln never joined a church, declaring, however, that if he

Cotton Seed Shortage Seen

COLLEGE STATION — (AP) — A serious shortage of cotton seed for 1951 plantings is possible, Fred C. Elliott, extension cotton work specialist at Texas A. and M., said Thursday.

He said there are two factors: 1. Unfavorable weather in the nation's heavy cotton producing areas, and 2. Increased 1951 plantings which will boost the demand for seed.

Elliott recommended that farmers who have a good seed supply of the better adapted varieties of cotton store this seed for 1951 planting use. Good gin-run seed of the adapted variety should be saved in each area to take care of the maximum acreage that might be planted in 1951.
