You pay all wages to workers and all salaries to corporate officers, and, so, every dime of tares that they pay comes from you in the prices you pay for bread, automobiles and the like. It maters not what the name or the method of collecting taxes. They are all paid out of the sweat of every or. One of the evils of politics is its attempt, and often success in liding this simple truth.

"Fxcess Profits Taxes" no only fall wholly on the consumer but they slow down production at the very time increased demand call for greater facilities to meet the increased needs of consumer and the government demands to fight a war. In fact, the only "Excess Profits" are those created by the artificial stimulation of government. "Excess Profits" are those profits obtained by political favoritism or an artificially created demand. That, in turn, requires t : equivalent excess in machines and effort. Every profit obtained on a free market is an earned profit. If it is high, it means the producer has made a high contribution to the people to meet their needs, for which they freely pay.

The public is led to think that the proposed tax is a tax on increased profits only-but that isn't what the bill provides. It requires a 75 per cent tax on all earnings over 75 per cent of the best three out of the last four years. If . business had two good years and two bad years, the socalled "Excess Profits Tax" might well apply on all earnings of new companies. A new company might earn nothing for three years. In its fourth year, earnings would be divided by three to fix a base for what will be disastrous taxes on such new industries as television, or any growing business. Even U. S. Steel won't put in excessive expans on to meet the artificial demands, unless it can use its so c lled "excess" profits to do so. So, the purpose of this tax is not the expansion of free business, ment itself. Its 3 per cent taxexempt bords are infinitely more profitable than investments in a

If a man is over 17 he must enlist in both the

naval reserve and regular Navy for four years. For the Air Force it's three years for both regular and reserve duty. If he goes into the active re-serves of the Air Force or Navy he has to give from two to five hours a week for drill and training. A small payment is made the man for this time. The chances of active duty are ex-

If a man is in college and does well in ROTC he can avoid the draft by signing a contract to serve two years of extended active duty after graduation.

That key answer to most men's basic draft and service problems is the last one which will be answered by "You and the Service." From now on all problems connected with service and the draft will be handled as regular news stories in this paper as the news on this subect develops.
