



federal government arranges with Los Angeles County to feed and maintain prisoners while their cases are awaiting trial. The L. A. County jail is far and away superior to many others, except that -while I don't know what its present status is-in 1942, at least, on the 12th floor where Federal political enemies of F. D. R. were kept, two prisoners occupied a cell and if there were too many three men were assigned and the odd one slept on the cement floor until the population decreased. Of course there were many cases of lumbago, neuralgia and rheumatism but a doctor who visited twice a week always carried plenty of aspirin. That was about all

he could do.

The food was about what might be expected except that a concession wagon went by the cell blocks once a day and a prisoner could buy a lot of dainties if he had any money. Otherwise he was out of luck. The boys did get a dispensed by the the Christian Scientists, however. They also got a shower once a week whether they needed one or not and sometimes if they were lucky, they received a clean pair of blue jeans with "L. A. County Jail" stamped on the seat once a month or so. I never could figure out why L. A. County stamped its name on the seat of a prisoner's jeans when that would be the first place to wear out. You wouldn't know, eh? The place was generally kept

pretty sanitary and bedbugs received a shot of spray each week. Most of the prisoners stripped to the waist to alleviate the heat and lack of fresh air. It was a comfort during the day but at night when the yellow lights came on in the cells giant cockroaches had a habit of coming out of the light fixtures and crawling around on the ceiling. This caused no end of apprehension and on one occasion a near-riot ensued when a certain fun - loving gentleman crept up behind a half-naked cellmate and tickled him on the back with a broom straw. The constant thought of having cockroach lose his footing and drop on one's head or back kept the men littery of an evening. When the lights went out at 9 p. m. the roaches were still directly overhead and every-

After all, there was no point in having some U.S. judge getting suspicious that the government wasn't getting all it paid for in the upkeep of its ners by the county. The L. A. You've often seen pictures in the papers of political prisoners or real criminals entering or leaving that building under a marshall's custody but you've never seen the inside of that bull-pen-or have you? If it hasn't improved it certainly needs some reforming and Congress power. should do something about it. There was one small room with one barred door leading to the Marshall's office. In that room there were often as many as 40 hot, sweating men awaiting a call "upstairs" where court was being held. There were benches accomodate perhaps 20 men and the rest of them sprawied out on the cigaret and spit-covered floor. That was where some of F. D. R.'s choicest political enemies spent a lot of time. There was one drinking fountain and it wouldn't work, letting out a drop of water at a time which the men caught in their cupped hands. The single toilet had no seat and was so covered with tobacco spit and so full of cigaret butts that most prisoners preferred constipation. One meal a day was served-at noon-consisting of two pieces of dry bread and one slice of bologna. By the time a man got back to the regular D. C. Jail after a day in the bull-pen it was too late to get any supper. Sometimes men spent as many as six days the court upstairs was ready to hear their plea or arrange for trial, and then there would be more long days in that dungeon. Nude-Eel attorneys naturally wanted to keep that up as long as possible where enemies of the Administration were concerned. If the prisoner happened to be noted as an anti-Communist he would find Reds, Nude-Eelers and fellow-travelers looking him over and laughing at him as he was led out of the bull-pen handcuffed to a marshall, and down the hall to the black jail wagon waiting

The Dector The Nation's Press Says

Late August is a gloomy time for about 10 or 12 million sufferers from ragweed hay fever,

The reason for the regularity is because ragweed begins to shed its pollen into the air at about the same time every When the sym-

toms are severe the nose alternates between a stage of running mucus and being completely stuf-fed up. The eyes water, itch and sometimes are so swollen that they can hardly be opened in the morning. Sneezing comes in fits of 20 or 30 sneezes at a time, leaving the victim slightly relieved but exhausted. Usually the person who has severe ragweed hay fever is completely miserable for three or four weeks and has some trouble for one or two weeks at either When the frost has destroyed

the pollen there is no further trouble unless a little dust which contains the pollen is stirred up. This does not mean that hay fever has no complications, however, as there is a tendency for those who have had hay fever for several years to develop asthma, which is a still more distressing condition than hay fever itself. Probably the best treatment for

ragweed hay fever for most people is to try to be desensitized, that is, to have the sensitiveness to the pollen decreased by injections or "shots" of pollen extracts. These are best given either all the year around or for several months before the season starts. Many hay fever victims are par-

tially and temporarily relieved by air conditioning. This relief is due to the filtering of pollen out of the air which is breathed in. Sometimes a room which has a pollen filter in the window gives a certain amount of comfort. A great many people plan to

take their vacations during the hay fever season and go to places where the pollen is either absent or very slight. In this way they can get relief for at least part of the time. Several drugs known as antihistamines and going under vari-

ous trade names bring considerable relief to many hav fever sufferers. These drugs act for only a short time, but they do help many hay fever victims when their symptoms are intolerable. They are not entirely lacking in undersirable effects, however, and therefore should not be taken without some medical supervision. Furthermore, some people seem to be helped more by one kind of preparation and some by another. Dr. Jordan will answer ques


