SHAMMIN A Approximately one mile of bas ing was completed Tuesday over the 4.4 mile stretch to be paved on Highway 70 north of Pampa. Adverse weather conditions have bogged down paving and dirt work operations on the fu-ture Pampa-Perryton route, State Highway Department engineers reported this morning.

However, crushers were able to run about one mile of basing and grading on the proposed paved stretch Monday and Tuesday. In the meantime, a few miles north of the paving work. excavation work has been progressing yard by yard except where wet and muddy terrain.
