

E. Stassen charged today the bill to cut excise taxes embodies an attempt by the treasury departs ment "to bring American colleges and universities under control of







Daily, a 11 a. m., master clocks over the nation, such as the one "We been with the company that went on the binge at Corsicana, are regulated by direct wire impulses from the Naval Observatory at Washington.

"Right on the dot, at 11 a. m., employes in the local offices are watching their master clocks to see if there is any change at the moment of regulation," said Moody. "The result is entered into a chart. Some of our master clocks go a year without losing as much as a second."

Pendulums on the master clocks are fitted with two tubes of weather-sensitive mercury to compensate balance when the temperature changes. A pendulum tends to swing faster in cold weather. The master clock regulates other Western Union clocks in its city every hour, on the hour.

Western Union has found that even the planned-sway of tall buildings disturbs pendulum sway enough to throw a clock off. "We had to replace all our pendulum, clocks in the First National Bank Building at El Paso with marine movement clocks which have balance wheels like a watch instead of pendulums," Moody said.

Master clocks are always on ground floors, unaffected by build-



Little industry wants to shoot Santa Claus! The eleventh conference of small business organizations is on record to that effect, and this conference speaks for about 600,000 small enterprises in 260 lines of business venture. They have condemned the practice of the federal government to make loans in their behalf. They are opposing federal guarantees for, or federal insurance of, loans made to them by private institu-Little industry is becoming a

bit frightened of this crawling monster, Big. Government, and the pressure that necessarily follows its favors and handouts. And these small businessmen are beginning to analyze the meaning of big debt. It, too, is frightening and they want the debt reduced starting now. They want all possible funds of the federal gov-

DECLARATIONS IMPORTANT. These declarations by small businessmen are important for they indicate an acceptance of the market at the market. This is the philosophy of Adam Smith, early British economist. It is the scheme that built the United States. It is a working plan which, of itself, will never fail to produce the best goods for the most people at a price they can afford and are willing to pay. This stand is representative of

American vision. These men are well aware that 80 percent of business ventures fail. This means that only 20 percent of such ventures are efficient enough to serve a free market. It also indicates that only 20 percent of such ventures are needed to serve such a market. When more are needed the market will absorb them, along with the proper cuality that only 20 percent of such venalong with the poorer quality goods and higher prices that such absorbtion entails.

Through sits action little business is recognizing that it is not the function of government to subsidize, through loans or guarantees of any nature, the marginal and submarginal firms that cannot meet consumer demand Such procedure only foists upon the people poorer goods at higher prices; and it discourages progress and efficiency. It is socialism and it heralds death to real enterprise and to that valuable thing; consumer choice.


