



The morale of many policemen has been undermined by constant cries of "police brutality." Yet real brutality comes from criminals who attack the lives and property of innocent people.

While protecting innocent citizens, many policemen have also been the victims of criminal brutality, as is clearly shown by deeply disturbing statistics recently released by the F.P.I. in its Uniform Crime Report for 1968.

Along with the rise in the crime rate throughout the country, direct attacks against policemen have been increasing. In 1968, 16 out of every 100 policemen were assaulted in the line of duty, an increase of 17 per cent over the preceding

A survey by each agency in each city of employment to make certain that living conditions for Negroes are what they should be in that community-and, if not, action on whatever can be properly done about it.

Managers and supervisors in the agencies are to be trained in spotting capable Negroes who believe they have been unjustly passed over for advancement.

Regular checks will be made on managers and supervisors to determine what results they're achieving. The firger will be pointed at agencies and those supervisors not making sufficient progress.


The question was asked by his manager, Gary Garafolo as he, DePaula and Napoli were leaving the restaurant. DePaula denied the conversation in testimony before the jury.



Umpires To Vote On Union

WASHINGTON (UPI) -The National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) has ordered an election to let the 24 American League baseball umpires decide whether they want to join a

In a 4-1 ruling, the board said that baseball is an interstate business and therefore subject to federal labor laws.

The American League has long resisted any organizing attempt by its umpires. Last year, two AL umpires,

Al Salerno and Bill Valentine, were fired, for what they said were their union activities. The National League umpires

belong to a union called the Independent Association of National Baseball League Um-

It was the NL union which filed unfair labor charges with the NLRB after the two AL umpires were sacked. The NLRB, in ordering an election within the next 30 days, did not specify a bargaining agent for the AL umpires, but it was presumed they would join the same union as their NL counterparts, if they vote to organize.

"Football and boxing have been held to be interstate commerce and thus subject to antitrust laws," the NLRB said.


