Send copies to your Congressman and Representative. Petition them to intervene and send you copies of their comments to BATF.

BATF asserts that they have the legal right to make the proposed changes without the consent of Congress. They intend to collect in a computer, for instant retrieval, all information needed to identify, locate, and seize all firearms registered. They intend to force gun dealers, manufacturers, gunsmiths, importers, and owners to report the purchase, sale, theft, loss, or other change of possession of any gun. They propose to stamp each gun with a 14 digit serial number, unique to that gun.

Why do all this, unless they intend to deprive us of our firearms? Without a willing seller, a willing, buyer, and an agreed price, they will be stealing from us.

What a frustrating week to have been in Washington. It was my privilege to again attend the Daughters of the American Revolution Continental Congress. I continue to be impressed with the integrity of the Daughters. The frusration lay in the realization ration lay in the realization hat the opinion of those women was single minded. And they in part made up the $80 \%$ of US
who opposed the surrender of our Canal in Panama. Yet the treaty passed by the same nearrowness (two votes) as did the neutrality pact. Tuesday, Aptil 18, 1978 should be remembered as a day of infamy-that being the day that 68 arrogant being the day that 68 arrogant senators defied their constitlents and succumbed to the pressure of a peanut farmer from Georgia and a communist dictator from Panama.
A group of Texans called upon the junior senator from their state on the day before the vote was cast. Few of us had much hope of swaying Mr . Bentsen, but we were aghast at the reception received. It seems he had promised some of those in the delegation an audience on that day. But we were told the good man was ut of the office-unavailable-busy-tied up. Well, we quietly stood in his office- 25 or so of us. At last we were ushered into his private sanctuary. Lloyd Bentsen was hostile, dispainful and nearly rude.
When asked how he justified casting a vote which reflected maybe twenty percent of his constituents, he informed us that if we expected him to vote on every issue according to opinion of his constituents, then we didn't need him or any other elected official in Washington. That we should simply register our opinion
