Net tox collections after discounts but including interest and penalties amounted to $\$ 253,687.34$ for the yeor ending September 30, 1949 in comparison to $\$ 188,379.15$ for the precedin gyear. The current year collections of $\$ 253,687.34$ were deposited to the following funds:

Delninquent and unpaid taxes as of September 30, 1949 amounted to $51,228.15$ in comparison to $\$ 43,265.39$ ee of September 30, 1948, on increase of $\$ 7,962.76$.

INDEBTEDNESS: The Bond indebtedness of the City of Pampa amounted to $\$ 1,556,000.00$ September 30,1949 , an increase of $\$ 497,000.00$ during the year. Bonds were retired in the amount of $\$ 53,000.00$, and odditional bonds in the amount of $\$ 550,000.00$ for Water and Sewer Improvements were issued. The indebtedness matures over a period of twenty years and is payable as follows:

Two separate Interest and Sinking Funds are maintained to service the Bonds and Interest payable from taxes, The "Water and Sewer Improvement Interest and Sinking Fund" is for servicing the 1948 Water and Sewer Improvement Bond issue in the amount of $\$ 550,000.00$, and the "General Interest and Sinking Fund" is for servic ing all other Tax Bonds.
A fund termed "1945 Water and Sewer Revenue Bonds Interest and Sinking Fund" is used for the purpose o servicing the 1945 Woter and Sewer Revenue Bond Issue and the income of the fund consists entirely of direct transfers from the Water and Sewer Fund.
The Bond indebtedness of the City of Pampa consists of seventeen separate issues bearing interest from $1-3 / 4 \%$ to $6 \%$. Although a number of the Bond issues were issued for the Water and Sewer Department they are all payable from taxes with the exception of the one issue.
