



enormity of our national debt, which is already forty percent greater than the total assessed value of all the taxable property in the nation, this can only in one eventuality — the devalua-tion of our dollar. Already operating with an unsound dollar ,it will then be even more unsound, and the end result will be repudiation of the national debt and the bank ruptcy of the nation. 



There is more cancer in the gastrointestinal tract (stomach and intestines) than in any other one system of the body. Therefore, any loss of weight which cannot be explained by dieting or other obvious cause is suspicious. Bleeding from the intestines or the presence of any mass, tumor, or swelling inside the abdominal cavity are causes for investigation. Last, while they had a sneaking Difficulty in swallowing or unexplained loss of appetite should also result in a prompt visit to the physician.

The next most common locations for cancer are in the breasts and in the Uterus or womb. Any lump in the breast is reason for examination. Any change in the nature of the bleeding from the womb or any discharge also require investigation.

Cancerous growth can develop in other places, such as the lungs, bladder or kidney, or the mouth. HOLLYWOOD - (AP) - My first meeting with Stage Star Marlon Brando was not impressive. He was lying in a veterans' hospital ward, sound asleep.

He awoke and said groggily, "I'll brush my teeth and get some coffee." He crawled out of bed and lowered himself by his arms into a wheelchair.

The 25-year-old sensation of "A Streetcar Named Desire" is living with paraplegics (men with the lower part of their bodies paralyzed) at Birmingham Hospital. He is preparing to portray a wounded veteran in a film called 'The Men.'

"You can't understand what it's like to be a paraplegic unless you have lived as one," said the actor as he was wheeled into the nospital refreshment room for



The company is introducing a new post card type statement this month, and at the same time changing the meter reading and billing dates for this area.

With the change some cusotmers will be billed for two periods during this month, but the bills will not be duplicates.

The new system is designed to provide more convenience for customers, because having the due dates for the various districts spread throughout the month will insure quicker service when you call at the local effice to make payment.

Customers who do not clearly understand the new billing policy are invited to visit the local office of the Southwestern Public Service Company if they desire a full explanation.


