## **Lucas Brands Proposal as** 'Dangerous'

Weekdays 5 Cents AP Leased Wire

WASHINGTON - (AP) -Senate Democratic Leader Lucas said "dangerous authority" lurks in the proposal to give President Truman power to slash up to three billion dollars in Congressional appropriations.

The Illinois senator lashed out Saturday at the powerful coalition of Democrats and Republicans backing the proposal as it headed for a vite Monday in the

Although a majority of 63 has demanded the right to ballot on the idea, the parliamentary situation may require suspension of the rules to vote on it. This would call for a two-thirds majority-or 64 senators if all 36 vote. The Lucas camp claims not all the 63 will support it.

Lucas told a reporter the proposal would give Mrs. Truman authority he does not want and involves purse-string controls that Congress "should be unwilling to surrender." It would order the President to







A grim picture was conjured up during the debate in the Consultative Assembly of the 12-nation Council of Europe just terminated in Strasbourg, France. The con-sensus was that Marshall Plan aid is producing little permanent effect on recovery and Europe is in for economic chaos if she can't achieve economic unity before the program ends in 1952.

The more gloomy prophets foresaw social upheavals and even wars if economic unity isn't achieved. Nobody contradicted statements that little long-range constructive work is being done under the Marshall Plan.

Speakers in the Assembly hammered on this question of eco-nomic union. America's aid was praised as generous and wise and criticism was leveled at the Marshall Plan countries them selves. They were charged with not having submerged national in-terests in the interest of Europe.

Council Drafts Bill of Rights For Europeans STRASBOURG, France - (AP)

A group within the European Consultative Assembly agreed yesterday on a basic bill of rights to protect fundamental freedoms the 12 nations making up the European Council.

Sir David Maxwell-Fyfe, Britain, chairman of the Assembly's Juridical Committee, said the committee decided to draft convention embracing at least 11 principal human rights. He emphasized that the 11 fun damentals could and probably would be expanded before the committee writes its final draft — possibly at Monday's session. Intended to provide a minimum standard, through a collective guarantee, these rights were: Security of person. Immunity Security of person. Immunity from arbitrary arrest, detention or exile. Exemption from slavery, servitude or forced labor of a

discriminatory nature. Freedom of speech and expressions of opinion. Freedom of Religious belief, practice and teaching. Freedom of association, Protection of natural rights pertaining to marriage, paternity and

### Drake No.1 Spouts Oil Again

TITUSVILLE, Pa.—(AP)—The nation's first oil well spouted black gold again but this time it was only borrowed petroleum.

Idle for 35 years, the celebrated Drake well went back into production for a few moments yesterday to mark the oil industry's 90th birthday celebration.

It was on a Saturday back in 1859 that Col. Edwin Drake-a railroad conductor turned oilman-sank a 69½ foot hole to open the first commercial well and establish the industry of oil.

Drake's prim, 64-year-old granddaughter, Mrs. E. Ross Carver of Nashua, N. H., pressed a button to reactivate the Drake well in all its glory.

Another high spot was the presentation of Drake's original tools-made by hand on a blacksmith's forge -to the Drake Museum located in the Drake Memorial

With these tools was started petroleum production that has spread to 26 states.



The secret is how to make cymbals. That doesn't sound like much of a secret—but the cymbal isn't as simple as it sounds. You don't have to age a saxaphone. You do a cymbal—it has to be

mellowed like a good wine. These musical noise-makers are as old as the Bible, but the Zildjian family has been manufactur-ing them only since 1623. It was that year that the first Avedis zildjian, a Constantinople alchemist, discovered a secret proc-ess for making an ideal cymbal metal from an alloy of tin, copper and silver.

Through the centuries the fam ily developed almost a world monopoly. They still dominate it. "It is easy to analyze the alloy we use," said the current Avedis Zildjian. "But no one can put it together-and some of the biggest metal companies in the country

have tried. Zildjian, a 59-year-old Armenian who came to this country in 1909, has done more than any other single man to make the musica world cymbal-minded.

"When I started, the bands only used one kind of cymbal—a heavy one," he said. "Now we have 171 models in different weights and sizes."

His 12-man factory at Quincy, Mass., now turns out thousands of cymbals yearly. The work is all done by hand, and it takes 45 days to turn the rude metal ingots into sounding brass. They must be hand-hammered from

four to six times. The cymbals then are stored in vaults anywhere from six months to 20 years until each reaches its proper resonance. Zildjian now has 40,000 in the process of aging. "And they have 40,000 different






