WASHINGTON-Decorating the home artistically on a shoestring is a challenge to ingenuity and can really be more exciting than planning with an unlimited budget. To achieve a distinctive room, despite penny-pinching, brings a thrilling glow of personal satis-

ishes for economic styling.

problem concerns the floors in some of the rooms of your home You expect eventually to have carpets for the whole house, let's say, but your present budget won't stretch that far. If the floors are hardwood, you will probably want to varnish or shellac them. But if they are of softwood, you may wish to employ floor enamel to supply decorative color as well as protect tion. If the walls are painted in a silvery gray, for instance, a rich, red floor would provide your color accent. With brighter walls, such as creamy yellow, deep green is admirable. When selecting the enamel, be sure that you get the kind intended especially for floors as these finishes are made with the toughness and elasticity to

to keep clean. If you have a wallpapered room which is dreary because the paper is faded, the emulsion type of paints offer an economical means of hiding faded or dingy wallpaper with cheerful colors. These paints come in paste form and are thinned with water. A single coat is usually sufficient saving the expense of applying primers and undercoats. Make sure, before application is begun, that the paper adheres firmly to the wall. Drying takes only about an hour, allowing a room to be decorated in the morning and made livable again by night-fall. The finish is suitable also for plaster and for virtually any painted or unpainted interior wall surface except glazed tile. color range is wide and standard

Who Buys The 'Free Lunch?'

"So here. It is reported that in the State of Illinois 48 per cent of those drawing unemployment compensation quit their jobs voluntar-The professional loafer and job jumper is encouraged to take on on public pay. You car find similar conditions everywhere. The pressure blocs, aided by the bleeding hearts, demand longer unemployment vacations at higher pay. Strikers demand to be supported by taxpayers while on strike. Many veterans who came back from war wholly unscathed demand huge bonuses and lifetime care for non-service connected disabilities at taxpayers' expense.

"Members of Chambers of Commerce demand federal pork for local improvements. They want someone else to build their schools and dredge Mud Creek. Labor unions demand more for doing less The Welfare State having promised to care for everyone from the cradle to the grave, the stampeds to get on the gravy train gathers speed. The mayors of American cities have formed a lobby in Washington to get the easy money of the political medicine men.

"Political charity beyond, a certain point releases forces no de cratic government can hold in check. It explains how the big city bose stays in power.
