Musical selections were presented by Mrs. Leroy Chapman organist. Prelude music was presented by Miss Catherine Jackson, Miss Kristy Smith and Miss Lesa Hensley. They sang The Wedding Song. Miss Karen Cox sang Evergreen and The Twelth of Never accompanied by Mrs. Chapman.

The bridal aisle was appointed with tall brass hurricane candlelabra with greenery and apricot satin ribbons. Vows were exchanged before a gold gothic archway covered with ivory, apricot and yellow silk gladiola, daisies and peonies with greenery. Candle tree stood on each side of the archway and held ivory catherdal tapers and apricot tapers and a white memory candle stood beneath the archway on a marble column.

Presented in marriage by her father, the bride wore aformal length gown of ivory chantilly fashioned with a scoop neckline edged with a double ruffle of Val lace. The long slender sleeves had a ruffle at the wrist. The full traditional tiered skirt flowed from the natural waisted bodice. 
