The trend is toward more and better passes. It looks like at least 1,000 more passes will be thrown with 600 more completions for 12,000 more yards and 130 more touchdowns than in 1947.

Last year 17,025 passes were thrown, a total of 7,130 completed for 102,348 yards and 821 touchdowns. Already aerial artists have flung 15,128 this season with 6,523 completions for 95,278 yards and 797 touchdowns.

The total yardage probably will exceed the 1947 gains by 30,000. The major teams covered 285,299 compared with 261,676 already raveled this year. The average gain per game is
