(The San Diego Union) The term "red herring" has been in use for many years in this country, mostly in political campaigns. It is a phrase usually applied to a week visited relatives and friends politician who seeks to divert attention from his own record by citing deficiencies in the record of

his opponent.
But the phrase hasn't been used too frequently in recent years un-til President Truman hauled it out again a few weeks ago to describe the activities of the congressional committee investigating un-American activities. Mr. Truman said the investigation, which unearthed some strange creatures in high government places, was a "red herring" to lead the people's minds away from his campaign to lower prices. Since then the phrase has been appearing with tiresome regularity in some of the current campaign material,

There is one thing about Mr.
Truman: when he hits upon a
phrase that is picked up and duoted a few times, he works it to death. Remember his earthy witticism that "I sort of like Old Joe"? The meeting in Washington where he spoke off the record and without manuscript, it drew a laugh and Mr. Truman was complimented for his droll, colloquial expression So he made it a part of a number of back platform speeches on his "non political" tour of the country and it returned to haunt him

until he dropped it.

But Mr. Truman is likely to regret the use of the "red herring" phrase for reasons other than that t may become tiresome, For, while it may appear that the congressional investigations diverted a measure of public attention from what patently was a political ges-ture on Mr. Trumans' part, the charge has been thrown back at him that he actually picked up the first fish and pretty ed the national political trail.
